## Rome, Nov. 22.

Rince Ludovifio, who is alfo Prince of Piombino, is daily expected here to take care of his own affairs, which during his able ice he entrufted to the care of the Cardinal his Uncle, and fome others, but received little fatisfaction from their management.

Cardinal Gabrieli, is by the interceffion of the Popes Sifter, difpenced with from his journey to his Refidency, for which favour he has paid his Compliments, and is now Treating for the Purchase of the Lands of Fiano, belonging to Prince Ludovisio.

Here is lately arrived the Gentleman of the Horfe to Don Pedro d' Arragon, the Viceroy of Naples, telling us, that a confiderable part of his Baggage is now upon the Road hither; and that the Viceroy inperfon intends on Innocents day to depart from Naples on his way hither, as Ambaffador Extraordinary of Obedience from the Crown of Spain, which charge he intends to execute with extraordinary Magnificency, and after Two months flay here, to return hence for Spain. The Marquis d' Afforga is like to fucceed in the Vice-Royalty of Naples, and the Marquis de Villa Franca, General of the Neopolitan Gallies, is to refide here as Ordinary Ambaffador.

The Pope is relolved to leave behind him fome Monuments of his Greatnefs, by repairing the broken Bridge, and finishing the Tribunal of Liberiana.

Four Gallies of the Squadron of Naples are daily expected at *Civita Vecchia* on their way towards fome Ports of *ruftan*, having on board them faveral Com anies of foot for the reliefe of the Spatish Garrifons in that Country.

Spat ish Garrifons in that Country. Here are lately arrived three Ambassfadors of Obedience from Ferrara, and others expected from Bologna.

The Savoye Ambaffador feems refolved not to comply fo fur with the Pope, as the *Florentite* Ambaffador hath done, as to demand the Popes Abfolution for the late breach of the Peace, which is the reason why the Pope will not as yet admit him to his preferce.

The five new Saints foi merly mentioned are to be folemnly canonized h next Lent, to whom Loren-20 Giuftiniani is also to be added.

Cardinal Rasponi has been lately ill, Lutis now upon his recovery, but Cardinal Antonio Barbarini is relapsed into a double Tertian Ague, and in much danger, Cardinal Savelli, is also under a great 1 disposition of Body.

The Pope has fent to Florence, a prefent for the Young Prince his Godfon, which is a piece of th true Crofs, richly fet about with Diamonds, and covered with a Crown, like that of the Dukes of *Tufcany*, adorned with great variety of pretious Stones.

Venice, Nov. 28. The Southernly winds have this week brought many ships into this Port from the Lewant, by whom we are informed, that the Plague is

much abated in *Candia*, which encourages the Magiftrates to purfue their intentions of beautifying that City, and encouraging Trade, by giving all perfons who shall apply themfelves to that place, an exemption from Customes, and allotting a confiderable proportion of Lands to all fuch as shall undertake either Tillage or Planting in that Island, which has already had for much effect, as to induce many perfons, not only from the Mountains in that Island, but from Morea, and other parts of the Continent to try their fortunes there.

The Captain-Baffa is daily expected in *Candia* with frefh recruits from *Mitelene*; by the fame fhips we are informed, that the Iflands in the *Archipelage* are very fenfible of the good effects of the late peace by the great increafe of their Trade, of which *Candia* it felf has its proportion, nothing being more wanting there then inhabitants. The Captain Baffa has lately received Two Exprefles with private Orders from the Grand Vifier; he is very much intent upon the fecurity of Merchants in their Trade into those parts, and has fent out a fquadron of his Gallies to inquire after fome Chriftian Privateers, which are faid to be cruifing upon these feas.

Proveditor-General Bernardo is at Zante, expecting there the nomination of his fucceflor, to whom he intends to commit the Fleet under his Command, in a good condition, and in order thereunto, prefles hard for a fupply of Rowers, the want whereof obliges feveral of his veflels to lye by, he having not men enough aboard them to conveigh them to Corfu.

Our Trade to Aleppo and Alexandria, is much revived, and our Confuls nominated for the faid places are hastening thither with all convenient diligence.

From the Levant we are informed, that the difgufts and jealoufies between the Grand Segnior and his Brother, are 10 far from being allayed, that the Janifaries and the leading perfons of the City of Conftantinople, are drawn in to elpoufe the perfecuted intereft, infomuch as the Grand Vifier finds all his endeavors fruftrated; the Sultanefs refolved not to part with any of her advantages; and confequently the Grand Segnior is not to be induced to truft himfelf in Conftantinople. Thefe intefline diffutes, as well as the many difficulties which they meet with in their defigne, fetting out their Fleet, gives us reafon to believe, that nothing confiderable will be attempted the next Spring by that Monarchy.

The Captain-General *Morofini* is acquitted from the charge formerly brought in againft him; and whereas upon the first acculation he had more then 600 Suffrages againft him, and only 200 for him; upon a fecond proposal, he has had 700 votes, affert-1 his innocence, and less then 200 against him.

Legorn, Dec. 1. The 28th paft arrived here a man of war belonging to Rotterdam from Genoua, where he had received feveral fhots upon a difpute about falutes: at his entry here he faluted this Port with Nine Guns, which the Caffle aufwered with Six. Here are now in Port the *John and Thomas*, bound for Venice, and the Guiny for Smirna, who wait for the arrival of the *Jerfey* Fregat, their defigned Convoy. The Mary and Lewis, are waiting the return öf Sir Jahn Harman from Zante, under whole protection they intend to fail for the Westwards.

The French lie before Tunis, with a squadron of 17 fail, and are lately entred into a Treaty of peace, and have in order thereunto, sent Four of their Officers on shoar, for whose safety they have taken on board them, Two Turkish Officers of great note: the points of greatest difficulty in the Treaty, are faid to be the restitution of Goods taken from the French, and the redemption of French Captives, which are faid to be about 300.

The Argerines are faid to have 14 fayl abroad in in Corfo, molt of them plying to the Eastwards. five of those Corfaires were some days fince dilcovered within fight of this Port, and gave chafe near Maunt Christo to a finall Vessel of this place, which happily faved herfelf in Port Ferrara.

This laft week the young Prince of Tuscany was folemnly baptized at Florence, Cardinal de Modicis supplying the place of Godfather on the behalf of the Pope.

Paris, Dec. 13. His most Christian Majesty continues his refolution to march the next Spring into Flanders with a confiderable Army, to have the Rendezvous for his Infantry at Dunkirk, but his Horfe to meet in Lorrain; at his return from thence, he designes a progress into Languedoc, to take a view of the great work of the Canal, for the Communication between the Two feas, which is much advanced, but may still require the work of some years. Here is lately arrived an antient person of 80 years

of age, faid to be employed hither by the King of Ardres in Guiny, his Train confifts only of Three Women, his wives, and Four or Five fervants : his bufinefs faid to be principally to contract for Negro's, his Majesty intends to receive him with much Ceremony and State.

His Majetty has lately reconciled the Duke Mazarine to his Dutchefs, who has privately vifited her, and was received with much tendernels and affection.

A Match is faid to be concluded between the Duke de Nevers and Madamoifelle de Tiange, Niece to Madam de Montespan : Monfieur de Tiange, the Father to the young Lady, attending his Majefty about this affair, was graciously received, and is fince made Lieutenant to the Company of men at Arms, Commanded by the Duke d' Anjou.

The perion who was lately seifed on at Luxem-bourg, and committed to the Basfille, proves to be the Chevalier de Lignerac, mistaken for his Brother, who is criminally profecuted, he was upon difcovery of the error, immediately released, but is not yet fatisfy'd for the affront which has been thereupon done to his perfon.

Father Francis Maria Rhini of Polizi, formerly Guardian in Ferufalem, and at present, General of the whole Order of St Francis, made his entry here the third instant in the Queens Coach, followed by a great Train of other Coaches, and folemnly preceded by a great number of Religious persons (who were formerly with him in the Holy Land) with Palm branches in their hands; the 6th initant he was conducted by the Sieur de Berlife, the Introducer of Ambassadors, to bis Audience from their Majesties, and the 9th instant was received with as much folemnity by his Royal Highnefs and Madamoifelle.

The 10th instant their Majesties with Monsieur and Madamoiselle went hence to Versailles, from whence they are this day again expected here.

Segnior Ravizza, Archbishop of Sidonia, and defigned Nuncio into Portugal, has made his application to his Majesty, to whom, (as he has fince to Monsteur) he presented a Brief from the Pope, and a Letter from Cardinal *Altieri*.

Bruffels Decem. 17. This last week his Excellency the Count de Monterey, went hence to take a view of Lovain, Tirlemont, and a Fortification which is raising at Leuwe. The 11th instant the Duke of Lorrain arrived at Cologne, where he was civily received and entertained, with the Princes of Vaudemont and Lillebonne. The Prince of Lorrain having had fome Conference with the Duke his Unkle, is returned with much satisfaction on his way back to Vienna

His Electoral Highness of Cologne is returned. to Bon, where he intends to make his Refidence; from whence he has fent a fecond protestation to the City of Cologne against their new Fortifications: The Magistrates of that City are sending three Members of their body to Bon, to Complyment the faid Elector upon his happy return from his late Voyage into Italy.

R Ichard Hallowell, alias Holloway, a Tobacco-cutter, lately dwelling in Fryingpan Alley in Petticoat-lane without Bishopsgate-fireet, a middle fized man, plump faced, with pockholes, of a demure countenance, baving a fort Brown Periwig, and fad coloured cloaths, about Forty years of age

Thomas Allen, alias Allyt, alias Ayliffe, who pretended himself a Chyrurgion or Doctor of Physick, semetimes living at Rumford in Effex, but lately lodging at or near Aldgate, being a man of a down look, Ican faced, and full of pochboles, with a stuff Coat, usually wearing a Worsted Camlet Cloak, and a Brown fhort Periwig, inclining to Red, about 36 years of age.

Thomas Hunt, a tall and well proportioned man, of a ruddy complexion, about 33 or 34 years of age, wearing a Flaxen Perimig, of a large Curl, and long, but fometimes of late a Black one; his Cloaths Black, and sometimes wearing a Brown Worsted Camlet Coat; long, and has one legg a little crooked or bow'd.

Hurlt, of a middle fire, good complexion, with a dark coloured Periwig, and commonly wears a Black Coat.
