**P**Prince *Ludoviso*, who is also Prince of *Piombino*, is daily expected here to take care of his own affairs, which during his absence he entrusted to the care of the Cardinal his Uncle, and some others, but received little satisfaction from their management.

Cardinal *Gabrieli*, is by the intercession of the Popes Sister, dispensed with from his journey to his Residency, for which favour he has paid his Compliments, and is now Treating for the Purchase of the Lands of *Fiano*, belonging to Prince *Ludoviso*.

Here is lately arrived the Gentleman of the Horse to Don *Pedro d' Arragon*, the Viceroy of *Naples*, telling us, that a considerable part of his Baggage is now upon the Road hither; and that the Viceroy in person intends on *Innocents day* to depart from *Naples* on his way hither, as Ambassador Extraordinary of Obedience from the Crown of *Spain*, which charge he intends to execute with extraordinary Magnificency, and after Two months stay here, to return hence for *Spain*. The Marquis *d' Astorga* is like to succeed in the Vice-Royalty of *Naples*, and the Marquis *de Villa Franca*, General of the Neopolitan Gallies, is to reside here as Ordinary Ambassador.

The Pope is resolved to leave behind him some Monuments of his Greatness, by repairing the broken Bridge, and finishing the Tribunal of *Liberiana*.

Four Gallies of the Squadron of *Naples* are daily expected at *Civita Vecchia* on their way towards some Ports of *Tuscany*, having on board them several Companies of foot for the relief of the Spanish Garrisons in that Country.

Here are lately arrived three Ambassadors of Obedience from *Ferrara*, and others expected from *Bologna*.

The *Savoie* Ambassador seems resolved not to comply so far with the Pope, as the *Florentine* Ambassador hath done, as to demand the Popes Absolution for the late breach of the Peace, which is the reason why the Pope will not as yet admit him to his presence.

The five new Saints formerly mentioned are to be solemnly canonized the next Lent, to whom *Lorenzo Giustiniani* is also to be added.

Cardinal *Rasponi* has been lately ill, but is now upon his recovery, but Cardinal *Antonio Barberini* is relapsed into a double Tertian Ague, and in much danger; Cardinal *Savelli*, is also under a great disposition of Body.

The Pope has sent to *Florence*, a present for the Young Prince his Godson, which is a piece of the true Cross, richly set about with Diamonds, and covered with a Crown, like that of the Dukes of *Tuscany*, adorned with great variety of precious Stones.

*Venice*, Nov. 28. The Southernly winds have this week brought many ships into this Port from the *Levant*, by whom we are informed, that the Plague is

much abated in *Candia*, which encourages the Magistrates to pursue their intentions of beautifying that City, and encouraging Trade, by giving all persons who shall apply themselves to that place, an exemption from Customs, and allotting a considerable proportion of Lands to all such as shall undertake either Tillage or Planting in that Island, which has already had so much effect, as to induce many persons, not only from the Mountains in that Island, but from *Morea*, and other parts of the Continent to try their fortunes there.

The Captain-Bassa is daily expected in *Candia* with fresh recruits from *Miteleno*; by the same ships we are informed, that the Islands in the *Archipelago* are very sensible of the good effects of the late peace by the great increase of their Trade, of which *Candia* itself has its proportion, nothing being more wanting there than inhabitants. The Captain Bassa has lately received Two Expresses with private Orders from the Grand Visier; he is very much intent upon the security of Merchants in their Trade into those parts, and has sent out a Squadron of his Gallies to inquire after some Christian Privateers, which are said to be cruising upon these seas.

Proveditor-General *Bernardo* is at *Zante*, expecting there the nomination of his successor, to whom he intends to commit the Fleet under his Command, in a good condition, and in order thereunto, presses hard for a supply of Rowers, the want whereof obliges several of his vessels to lye by, he having not men enough aboard them to convey them to *Corfu*.

Our Trade to *Aleppo* and *Alexandria*, is much revived, and our Consuls nominated for the said places are hastening thither with all convenient diligence.

From the *Levant* we are informed, that the disputes and jealousies between the Grand Segnior and his Brother, are so far from being allayed, that the Janisaries and the leading persons of the City of *Constantinople*, are drawn in to espouse the persecuted interest, insomuch as the Grand Visier finds all his endeavors frustrated; the Sultanes resolved not to part with any of her advantages; and consequently the Grand Segnior is not to be induced to trust himself in *Constantinople*. These intestine disputes, as well as the many difficulties which they meet with in their designe, setting out their Fleet, gives us reason to believe, that nothing considerable will be attempted the next Spring by that Monarchy.

The Captain-General *Morosini* is acquitted from the charge formerly brought in against him; and whereas upon the first accusation he had more than 600 Suffrages against him, and only 200 for him; upon a second proposal, he has had 700 votes, asserting his innocence, and less than 200 against him.

*Legorn*, Dec. 1. The 28th past arrived here a man of war belonging to *Rotterdam* from *Genoua*, where he had received several shots upon a dispute about salutes: at his entry here he saluted this Port with Nine Guns, which the Castle answered with Six. Here are now in Port the *John and Thomas*, bound for *Venice*, and the *Guiny* for *Smirna*, who wait for the arrival of the *Fersy* Fregat, their designed Convoy. The *Mary and Lewis*, are waiting the return

of Sir John Harman from Zante, under whose protection they intend to sail for the Westwards.

The French lie before *Tunis*, with a Squadron of 17 sail, and are lately entred into a Treaty of peace, and have in order thereunto, sent Four of their Officers on shoar, for whose safety they have taken on board them, Two Turkish Officers of great note: the points of greatest difficulty in the Treaty, are said to be the restitution of Goods taken from the French, and the redemption of French Captives, which are said to be about 300.

The Argerines are said to have 14 sayl abroad in in *Corso*, most of them plying to the Eastwards. five of those Corsaires were some days since discovered within sight of this Port, and gave chase near *Mount Christo* to a small Vessel of this place, which happily saved herself in Port *Ferrara*.

This last week the young Prince of *Tuscany* was solemnly baptized at *Florence*, Cardinal *de Medicis* supplying the place of Godfather on the behalf of the Pope.

*Paris, Dec. 13.* His most Christian Majesty continues his resolution to march the next Spring into *Flanders* with a considerable Army, to have the Rendezvous for his Infantry at *Dunkirk*, but his Horse to meet in *Lorraine*; at his return from thence, he designs a progress into *Languedoc*, to take a view of the great work of the Canal, for the Communication between the Two seas, which is much advanced, but may still require the work of some years.

Here is lately arrived an antient person of 80 years of age, said to be employed hither by the King of *Ardes* in *Guiny*, his Train consists only of Three Women, his wives, and Four or Five servants: his business said to be principally to contract for Negro's, his Majesty intends to receive him with much Ceremony and State.

His Majesty has lately reconciled the Duke *Marzarin* to his Dutchess, who has privately visited her, and was received with much tenderness and affection.

A Match is said to be concluded between the Duke *de Nevers* and *Madamoiselle de Tiange*, Niece to *Madam de Montespan*: Monsieur *de Tiange*, the Father to the young Lady, attending his Majesty about this affair, was graciously received, and is since made Lieutenant to the Company of men at Arms, Commanded by the Duke *d'Anjou*.

The person who was lately seized on at *Luxembourg*, and committed to the *Bastille*, proves to be the Chevalier *de Lignerac*, mistaken for his Brother, who is criminally prosecuted; he was upon discovery of the error, immediately released, but is not yet satisfy'd for the affront which has been thereupon done to his person.

Father *Francis Maria Rhini* of *Polizzi*, formerly Guardian in *Jerusalem*, and at present, General of the whole Order of *St Francis*, made his entry here the third instant in the Queens Coach, followed by a great Train of other Coaches, and solemnly preceded by a great number of Religious persons (who were formerly with him in the *Holy Land*) with Palma branches in their hands; the 6th instant he was conducted by the *Sieur de Berlise*, the Introducer of Ambassadors, to his Audience from their Majesties, and the 9th instant was received with as much solemnity by his Royal Highness and *Madamoiselle*.

The 10th instant their Majesties with Monsieur and *Madamoiselle* went hence to *Versailles*, from whence they are this day again expected here.

Signior *Ravizza*, Archbishop of *Sidonia*, and designed Nuncio into *Portugal*, has made his application to his Majesty, to whom, (as he has since to Monsieur) he presented a Brief from the Pope, and a Letter from Cardinal *Altieri*.

*Brussels Decem. 17.* This last week his Excellency the Count *de Montcrey*, went hence to take a view of *Louvain*, *Tirlemont*, and a Fortification which is raising at *Leuwe*. The 11th instant the Duke of *Lorraine* arrived at *Cologne*, where he was civilly received and entertained, with the Princes of *Vaudemont* and *Lillebonne*. The Prince of *Lorraine* having had some Conference with the Duke his Uncle, is returned with much satisfaction on his way back to *Vienna*.

His Electoral Highness of *Cologne* is returned to *Bon*, where he intends to make his Residence; from whence he has sent a second protestation to the City of *Cologne* against their new Fortifications: The Magistrates of that City are sending three Members of their body to *Bon*, to Compliment the said Elector upon his happy return from his late Voyage into *Italy*.

**R**ichard Hallowell, alias Holloway, a *Tobacco-cutter*, lately dwelling in Fryingpan-Alley in Petticoat-lane without Bishopgate-street, a middle sized man, plump-faced, with pockholes, of a demure countenance, having a short Brown Periwig, and sad coloured cloaths, about Forty years of age.

Thomas Allen, alias Allyt, alias Ayliffe, who pretended himself a Chyrurgion or Doctor of Physick, sometimes living at Rumsford in Essex, but lately lodging at or near Aldgate, being a man of a down look, lean faced, and full of pockholes, with a Staff Coat, usually wearing a Worsted Camlet Cloak, and a Brown short Periwig, inclining to Red, about 36 years of age.

Thomas Hunt, a tall and well proportioned man, of a ruddy complexion, about 33 or 34 years of age, wearing a Flaxen Periwig, of a large Curl, and long, but sometimes of late a Black one; his Cloaths Black, and sometimes wearing a Brown Worsted Camlet Coat; long, and has one legg a little crooked or bow'd.

— Hurst, of a middle size, good complexion, with a dark coloured Periwig, and commonly wears a Black Coat.

These being with great probability suspected to have been of the number of those who made the late barbarous and inhumane attempt upon the person of his Grace the Duke of *Ormond*: whosoever shall give notice of them to the Right Honorable the Lord *Arlington* His Majesties Principal Secretary of State, shall be liberally rewarded for his pains.

Upon inquiry it is found, that the said persons after the aforesaid assassinate attempted, made their way towards *Knightsbridge*, and that they took the Thames near to the Near-houses by *Turtle-fields*: afterwards making their way through *Lambeth* into *Southwark*, 4 of them upon two horses, and another singly mounted upon a black Mare with one white foot, about 16 hands high, which Mare was formerly seized at *Lambeth*, as belonging to the aforesaid *Thomas Hunt*, who was then apprehended for attempting a Robbery on *Smytham-bottom* in *Surrey*.
