Notice of application for licence to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority North West Region, by British Waterways, Greycaine Road, Watford WD2 4JR, for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from the Leeds and Liverpool Canal between National Grid Reference SD 4125 1225 and SD 4195 1240 at Burscough. 27.276 cubic metres per hour, 272.76 cubic metres per day, 5 megalitres per annum. Notice of application for consent for the purposes of section 88

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Schedule 10 of the above Act that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority by Severn Trent Water Ltd., for consent to discharge up to 772 cubic metres per day of treated sewage effluent and in admixture partially treated storm sewage for flows in excess of this figure to the Corn Brook, at National Grid Reference SO 6075 7418 from Clee Hill (Coreley) Water Reclamation Works, Coreley, Shropshire. This is an application to replace an existing consent that currently authorises the discharge of 106 cubic metres per day of treated sewage effluent under dry weather conditions and settled storm sewage for flows in excess of 302 cubic metres per day. The new works has a design dry weather flow of 139 cubic metres per day.

ASHFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Ashford Borough (Ashford Road, Kingsnorth (A2070) and the Romney Marsh Road, Ashford (A2042/A2070)) and the Ashford Borough (Bad Munstereifel Road (A2070) Ashford) (De-Restriction) Orders 1992.

Notice is hereby given that Ashford Borough Council as agents for Kent County Council propose to make the above Orders under sections 82(3) and 83(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Orders will be to de-restrict (i.e. to make subject to speed limits of greater than 30 m.p.h.) the following lengths of road for the purposes of section 81 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

1. *Romney Marsh Road (A2042/A2070)*, between the roundabout at its junction with Norman Road to the roundabout at its junction with Ashford Road, Kingsnorth.
2. *Ashford Road, Kingsnorth, (A2070)*, between the roundabout at its junction with Romney Marsh Road to the existing 40 m.p.h. speed limit.
3. *Ashford Road, Kingsnorth*, between its junction with Romney Marsh Road (A2070) and the existing Ashford Road at Saw Lodge Corner.
4. *Bad Munstereifel Road*, both carriageways between its junction at the M20 interchange at Willesborough (junction 10) and the roundabout at the junction with Malcolm Sargent Way and Romney Marsh Road, Ashford.

BASILDON DISTRICT COUNCIL

The District of Basildon (Link Road between Mandeville Way and Durham Road, Laindon) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of Basildon pursuant to arrangements made with Essex County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the Essex Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, made the following Order on 16th April 1992, the effect of which is:

- (a) To prohibit all vehicles (including cycles) to proceed in that length of road linking Durham Road and Mandeville Way (Road 50) Laindon.
- (b) To revoke The District of Basildon (Road 50 Busway, Laindon) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1986 which currently enables public service vehicles and cyclists to use this link road.
