The County of Humberside (Boothferry Borough) (Market Place, Snaith) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the Humberside County Council propose to make a Road Traffic Regulation Order the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in the following road:

KINGSTON-UPON-HULL CITY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside, Kingston-upon-Hull (Bilsdale Grove, Footbridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrian Through Traffic) Order 1992.

Notice is hereby given that the Kingston-upon-Hull City Council by virtue of section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, and section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, has made an Order the effect of which is to prohibit any person from proceeding along Bilsdale Grove Footbridge, Kingston-upon-Hull, in the county of Humberside.

The alternative route for pedestrians is to proceed west along Bilsdale Grove and then turning south down Southcoates Lane to the point where it meets Public Footpath No. 17 and vice-versa from this point for pedestrians proceeding in the opposite direction.

The Order will come into effect on 16th July 1992, and will continue in force for a period not exceeding three months or until the works which it is proposed to carry out have been completed, whichever is the earlier. If the works are not completed within three months the Order may be extended for a longer period with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport.

KINGSTON-UPON-HULL CITY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Kingston-upon-Hull) (Part of the Southern Carriageway of Jameson Street) (Prohibition of Driving) (Amendment) Order 1992.

Notice is hereby given that the Kingston-upon-Hull City Council on 15th July 1992, made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into operation on Monday, 20th July 1992.

The effect of the Order is to allow Hackney Carriages to drive over a 10 metre portion of Jameson Street from its junction with Bond Street, Hull, between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. only. At present only buses and emergency service vehicles are allowed access to the area.
