ST. James's February 18. The following Addresses have been presented to his Majesty.

An humble Address of the Bailiff and Burgesses of the Borough of Midhurst in the County of Sussex; presented to his Majesty by John Fortescue-Aland, Esq; Solicitor-General to his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and one of the Representatives of that Borough, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the Absence of his Grace the Duke of Somerset.

An humble Address of the Inhabitants of the Borough of Antrim in Ireland, presented to his Majesty by Clotworthy Upton, Esq; introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Sunderland, Lord Lieutenant of that Kingdom.

An humble Address of the Lord Lieutenant, Deputy Lieutenants, Justices of the Peace, Clergy, and Gentry of the County of Lincoln; presented to his Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the absence of the Right Honourable the Earl of Lindsey, Lord Great Chamberlain.

Which Addresses his Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Petersbourg, Jan. 21. Yesterday being the Day of Thanksgiving for the King of Great Britain's happy Accession to the Throne, Mr Mackenzy his Majesty's Resident here entertained at Dinner all the Foreign Ministers, with some Persons of Distinction of this Court, several Ladies, and the principal Merchants of the British Nation to the Number of 54 in all. The Czar continues here: Some Regiments of Russian Horse are said to be on their March hither from Finland; and that after being new clothed they are to proceed to join the Body of Forces commanded by Prince Repnin on the Frontiers of Courland.

Stockholm, Jan. 29. The 20th of this Month being the Day appointed in Great Britain for returning Thanks to God for his Majesty King George's Accession to the Throne, the same was observed here by the Subjects of the British Nation with all Demonstrations of Duty and Loyalty. In the Forenoon Divine Service was performed in the House of Mr. Jackson his Britannick Majesty's Resident, and a Sermon suited to the Occasion was preached by Mr. Dubordieu the Resident's Chaplain. After which all the British Merchants and others, together with the Resident of the States-General, and other Persons of Distinction, were entertained at Dinner by Mr. Jackson; during which above 200 Guns were fired at the Drinking of his Majesty's, their Royal Highnesses, and other Healths, a Signal being given to the British Ships in the Harbour by ten Guns placed in the Resident's Garden for that purpose; and in the Evening his whole House was illuminated, and two Casks of Wine ran from a Balcony to the People in the Street till 10 a Clock. The 19th four Troops of Cavalry, part of a Regiment called the Life-Regiment, marched through this City in their Way to Carlscrona, the said Regiment being one of those which his Swedish Majesty has ordered to be sent over to him: The other Regiments which his Majesty has named to be transported to Pomerania are, the East-Goths, the North and South Scoringers, the Smolanders, and Colonel Bennet's, all five Cavalry, with the Seareberg, Calmar and Lahn Regiments of Infantry, which together will make full 9000 Men. The 22d Lieutenant-General Lieven, Director of the Marine Affairs, set out from hence for Carlscrona, in order to begin the fitting out of the Squadron of Men of War which is to convoy the Transports with these Troops: For which Service the Chamber of Contributions have af-

signed to that General the Taxes of the Provinces adjoining to Carlscrona: In the mean while the Regiments ordered on this Expedition are all in Motion towards that Place, tho' as two of them have near 160 Leagues to March, 'tis computed they cannot reach thither before the End of March. On the 24th, the Marriage of the Princess Ulrica Eleanora with the Hereditary Prince of Hesse-Cassel was declared at this Court; and the same Evening her Royal Highness and the Prince received the Compliments of the Senators, Foreign Ministers, and Officers of the Court, on that Occasion; as they have likewise since done from the Clergy of this City, and the several Courts and Colleges; but 'tis not yet known when the Nuptials will be celebrated. The Day they were betrothed, the Prince made her Royal Highness a Present of Diamonds valued at 30000 Crowns.

Vienna, Feb. 10. We have Letters from Constantinople dated the 10th of last Month, which give an account, that by order of the Grand Signior the Venetian Consul and Merchants at Smyrna were obliged to embark and to depart that Place the 26th of December: Two Ships belonging to the Venetian Merchants which had been detained at Constantinople, were set at liberty the 2d of January, and immediately sailed for Venice, having on Board all the Subjects of that Republic which were at Constantinople; only the Baillo or Ambassador of that State is still kept in his Confinement. On the 5th of January an Aga was dispatched from the Port, with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary and a Retinue of 28 Persons, to endeavour to prevail with this Court not to give any Assistance to the Venetians. The Grand Signior proposed to be going in the beginning of April to Dispotjaylaty, near Larissa, to hasten the March of the Troops towards the Mores.

Hambourg, Feb. 19. 'Tis advised from Berlin, that the King of Prussia was gone to Brandenburg, to take a Review of some Regiments there, and will return to Berlin the 24th Instant. Count Flemming, Minister of the King of Poland, set out from Berlin the 12th of this Month for Warsaw, whence he proposes to return to the Court of Prussia within three Weeks. 'Tis advised from Copenhagen, that the King of Denmark has given order for having every thing in readiness for his Departure, his Majesty being determined to go to Holstein as soon as the Season will permit. On the 15th several Companies of Danes passed from the Datchy of Bremen to Holstein, which with two Regiments, from Jutland, are to join the Troops already posted along the Trave.

Brussels, Feb. 21. Two Days ago M. Vandenberg, Minister of the States-General for the ordinary Affairs of the Spanish Netherlands, had an Interview at Mechlin with Count Rechteren one of their High Mightinesses Plenipotentiaries for regulating the Barrier: The former returned hither the same Evening; as the latter did to Antwerp, and proceeded the next Morning for Holland. Last Night M. de Welderen, another Deputy of their High Mightinesses, arrived here from the Hague; after a stay of two or three Days he will go on to Maestricht, whither he is sent by the States in order to renew the Magistracy of that Place. Count Lanney is set out for Namur, to enter upon his Employment of Administrator of that Province, as well as of Luxembourg in the Emperor's Name.

Hague, Feb. 22. Yesterday the States of Holland came to a Resolution for the Payment of the Men of War that are to be fitted out to serve in the Baltick. Mr. Cadogan passed through Francfort the 16th Instant on his way to the Court of Vienna, where 'tis reckoned he arrived as this Day. There are Advices, that the Elector of Cologne has determined to set out from Liege the 25th of this Month with his Guards for Bonn, and that he has order-

ed three Regiments to follow him. Sig. Vincenti, who was formerly Resident here from the Republick of Venice, arrived a few Days ago: 'Tis reported that he is to go to Amsterdam to Purchase some Ships, and that he will afterwards go over to England. Upon the Nomination of an Administrator of the Province of Namur by Count Coningsleck, it was judg'd expedient for Count Hompefch Governour of the Town of Namur, to repair thither with all Diligence; accordingly that General set out from hence some Days ago. The States General continue to offer to withdraw the Troops they have in Bonn, provided assurances be given them on the part of the Emperor, that the Fortifications of that Place shall be Demolished within three Months after the Restoration of the Elector of Cologne, pursuant to the Treaty of Utrecht; which offer Baron Heems the Imperial Envoy is to communicate to the Court of Vienna. Some Days ago Count Coningsleck the Emperor's Minister acquainted the Deputies of this State at Antwerp, that certain Commissioners appointed by him to examine the Tariffs and Regulations of Commerce in the Spanish Netherlands, had made a good Progress in that Affair, and would be ready to enter into Treaty thereupon with Persons Authorized by this State towards the end of this Week: But that the said Commissioners living at Brussels, and being charged with divers other Affairs it would be convenient that their High Mightinesses Commissioners should repair thither to Negotiate and settle a Treaty of Commerce: Which Proposition is referred to the Deputies for Foreign Affairs. The States of Holland will separate to Morrow, and reassemble the 15th of March.
