BOUT fix Weeks ago arrived here from St. Malo three French Ships, viz. the Conquerant and the Triomphant of 56 Gunseach, and the Princess de Valois of 20: And they are newly joined from Port Louis by the Pelerin of 46 Gons, and the Sr. Jago of 34. They are all five laden with Goods proper for the Spanish West Indies, whicher they are bound under the Command of the Chevalier Marcines of the Order of St. Louis, pursuant to an Agreement made some sime sines with Mor sicur Orry: The Cours sent an Order for their unlading their Cargoes here, and passing into the Mediterranean for the King's present Service, before they proceed to New Spain; which Order the Chevalier Martinet Monfieur Orry, no such Stipulation was made for serving his Catholick Majesty; but the like Order being repeated, its now said he will no longer result to comply with the Court.

Stralfund, Feb. 22, An Ordinance has been published bere in the Name of the King of Sweden, importing, that whereas the great Charges now born by the Kingdom will not allow the paying of those who are in the Service of the Crown their full Appointments, therefore so much of every one's Salary shall be paid in ready Mony as the necessary publick Expences will permit; that for the rest they shall have Notes issued to thom, which shall easily a per Cont Joycost powers will be paid. which shall carry 5 per Cent. Interest yearly till they are discharged; that his Majesty will settle a Fund for that Interest; and that the said Notes shall be received in Part of Payment of the Imposts or Duties arising to his Ma-jesty, that is to say three fourths of the Duties in ready Mony and the other fourth in those Notes. Ratisbon, March 4.
