(b) any person causing any vehicle to enter Ludgate Square for the purpose of loading or unloading a vehicle therein or for the purpose of gaining access to off street premises accessible only

therefrom; or

(c) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency.

- (a) in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the City
