Vienna, April 10. The Emperour has written a Letter to the King of Sweden in very pressing Terms, in which he exhorts him to hearken to reasonable Conditions of Peace, and to fend his Ministers for that purpose to the Congress at Brunswick: His Imperial Maje-fly has also written a like Letter to the King of Poland, wherein, besides the general Exhortations to Peace, 'tis intimated, that if these Endeavours should not at present have Success, the King as Elector, and consequently Privy Counsellour of the Empire, should consider by what Means Foreign Powers might be best kept from intervening in Diffrutes wherein the Territories of the Empire in particular are concerned, the Decision of which ought to be reserved to the Emperour as their Chief. Advices from Buda of the 2d Instant tell us, that the Turks are making great Preparations on the Frontier, and talk of forming a Camp near Belgrade: They add, that two hundred Yards of the Walls of Buda having lately fallen in, and the former Ruins in the Fortifications being still unrepaired, a Sum of Money is necessary to be remitted from hence in order to the putting that Place into a State of Defence. This Court is confulting upon the properest Methods for supplying the Places

and Troops in Hungary with all things requisite for fustaining a War on that Frontier if need be.

Ratisbon, April 15. The King of Prussia has given Advice to his Ministers at the Dyet here, of a Declaration lately made in his Name to the Court of Vienna, importing, that he had never any Intention to accept the Mediation of France upon the Points in Dispute between his Majesty and the King of Sweden, but by the Emperor's Consent and in Conjunction with him. The E-lector of Bavaria in his Passage was treated 5 Days by the Duke of Wirtemberg with very great Magnificence, and left Marks of his usual Generosity in that Court. His Electoral Highness is now with his whole Family at Munich, whither he came without any Ceremony: Some fay his intended publick Entry is quite laid aside, others that 'tis only suspended till the Arrival of the Elector of Cologne, who is expected in these Parts about the End of next Month. M. Bosen the Saxon Minister has received Orders from the King of Poland to wait on the Elector at Munich, and make him a Compliment on his Return to his Dominions.

Hambourg, April 19. Letters from Dresden give an Account, that they had Advice there that the King of Pruffia did not accept the French Mediation between him and the King of Sweden, but on the previous Conditions that Stetin and the Territories comprehended in the Treaty of Sequestration should be left in his Prussian Majesty's Hands till the Peace, and that the Sums of Money advanced on Occasion of that Treaty should then

The following Address has be made good; that his Swedish Majesty should engage not to invade Saxony or Poland, and that he should connot to invade Saxony or Poland, and that he should confent to enter into a Negoriation for composing the War in the North: These Letters add, that for better securing those Conditions, the Prussian Troops are moving towards their Rendezvous appointed near Schwedt, that the necessary Preparations for their taking the Field are hastened, and the fortifying of the Passes on the Frontiers continued. The Saxon General Hallard received Orders the 11th-Inflant from Field-Marshal Count Flemming (who arrived at Berlin the 10th) to cause 8000 Saxon Foot and 6 Squadrons of Horse to march to Lubben; where they are to arrive by the 20th of this Month, to encamp there till the 28th, and to be at Schwedt by the 4th of May. Another Body 6000 Saxons is to be posted at Naumbourg, to observe the Motions of the Hessians. 'Tis advised from Copenhagen the 16th Instant, that the King of Denmark had sent to General Dewitz to repair forthwith from Berlin to Holstein, there to resume his Post in the Army; and that his Majesty will set out from Copenhagen soon after Easter, having fixed the 8th of next Month for taking a general

Review of his Troops in Holstein.

Hague, April 23. Mr. Walpole, the British Minister here, having received the King his Master's Letter notifying to the States General his being recalled from hence upon Mr. Cadogan's Return from Vienna, he accordingly delivered the same this Morning to the President of the Week, and at the same time took his Leave of their High Mightinesses by a Memorial: He intends to leave this Place as foon as he has his Recredentials, and will return to England in the Yatcht which lately brought over the Countess of Portland hither. M. Vandenbergh, their High Mightinesses Minister for the ordinary Affairs of the Spanish Netherlands, arrived here the 19th from Bruffels; and M. Vanderduffen and M. Gockinga, Plenipotentiaries of this State for regulating the Barrier, are daily expected from Antwerp.

Whitehall, April 15. On the 12th Instant died Thomas Marquis of Wharton, Lord Privy Seal; and is fucceded in Honour and Estate by his only Son Philip now Marquis of Wharton.
