ST. James's, May 6. The following Addresses have been presented to his Majesty.

An humble Address of the Protestant Dissenting Ministers in the County of Dorset; was presented to his Majesty by Mr. Christopher Taylor, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly of the Bermudas or Summer Islands in America; was presented to his Majesty by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Esq; one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Sheriffs, Recorder, Justices of the Peace, Aldermen, Burgesses, Common Council, Clergy, Gentlemen, Freemen, Freeholders and Principal Inhabitants of the City of Limerick; was presented to his Majesty by the Right Honourable the Earl of Sunderland, Lord-Lieutenant of Ireland.

An humble Address of the High Sheriff Grand-Jury Justices of the Peace and Gentlemen of the County of York, met at the Assizes held there the 15th of March; was presented to his Majesty by Colonel Northcliffe, High-Sheriff of the said County, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret, Gentleman of the Bed-chamber in waiting.

Which Addresses his Majesty was pleas'd to receive very graciously.

Turin, April 24. The Dutchess Dowager of Savoy entering into her 72d Year on the 11th Instant, received the Compliments of the Nobility on that Occasion. Their Sicilian Majesties arriv'd here on the 16th, but after 4 Days stay went back to la Venerie, where they will reside till all Things are ready for their Journey to Savoy, which 'tis thought will be about the Middle of next Month. The Prince of Carignan lies dangerously ill of a Fever. 'Tis advis'd from Rome, that the Marquis del Borgo, whom his Majesty lately sent thither to endeavour to reconcile the Differences with the Holy See, touchin' the Ecclesiastical Authority and Immunity as well in Sicily as in his Majesty's Hereditary Dominions, has had an Audience of the Pope, and been receiv'd by him to Cardinal Paulucci, with whom he has begun to Treat: There was at first some Difficulty about the Ceremonial but the Marquis was at length admitted to his Audience in the same Manner as the Ministers of other crown'd Heads wearing his Hat and Sword. Baron Schuembourg Lieutenant General of Foot, set out to Day for Casal and other Frontier-Places towards the Milaneze, and is a so to make a Tour to the Places on the Side of France, to review all our Infantry; and Count Non Lieutenant General of Horse, will be going in a Day or two, to take a like Review of the Horse.

Madrid, April 29. On the 18th Instant an Express arriv'd from Utrecht, with the Ratification of the Treaty between this Crown and that of Portugal; whereupon the Peace was proclaimed with the usual Ceremonies, and Illuminations were made throughout this City three Nights successively. The King and Queen assist'd in the Church of St. Jerom at the Devotions and Offices of the Holy Week, and on Holy Thursday his Majesty wash'd the Feet of twelve poor Men, and serv'd them at Table himself: The same Evening their Majesties accompanied by the Grandees and attended by the Guards, visit'd the seven Churches which are nearest to the Palace of Buen-Retiro, the Prince of Asturias with the Cardinal del Giudice his Governor and all his Household preceding them. The 23d was fix'd for their Majesties Removal to Aranjuez, with the Prince and the Infantes; but the Queen finding her self a little out of Order, the Journey is put off to the 2d of next Month. Don Luis de Miraval who is nominat'd Ambassador to the Republick of Holland, and the Marquess de San Phelipe who

is appointed Envoy to the Statè of Genoa, having had the usual Allowances for Equipage advanced to them, and received their Instructions, are preparin' to set out on their respective Journeys by the End of this Week: 'Tis believ'd they will soon be followed by the Prince de Cellamare who is nominat'd Ambassador to the King of France, because the Duke de Pfulis is order'd to follow the Court to Aranjuez, and to assist in the Privy-Council in the Room of that Prince. The Sicilian Ambassador has notified to the Court the Death of the Prince of Piemont. Mr. Bourck, formerly Agent here from the Court of St. Germain's, being appointed his Catholick Majesty's Envoy to the King of Sweden, has had Order sent him to hasten to Pomerania; he will pass by Sea from Lisbon to Hambourg. This Morning, by Order from the King it was signify'd to Don Bernardo Tinagero Secretary of State for Affairs of the Marine and of Commerce, that he should deliver to the Marquis de Grimaldo all the Papers relating to those Affairs, and also to those of the Indies which came into his Hands from the Time he has exercis'd this Employment, which his Majesty has thought fit to abolish: His Majesty has been pleas'd however, in Consideration of his diligent Service, to make him a Councillor of the Treasury. This Suppression of his Office gives Ground to believe, that the other Secretaries Offices will be reduc'd to two, as they were before Monsieur Orry's Plan of Administration took Place. The Advices from Barcelona import only that the imbarking of the Troops and proceeding on the Expedition against Majorca is still suspend'd, till the Court send Orders. We have an Account from Ceuta, that on the 12th of this Month being the Festival of St. Mary of Atrica, Patroness of that Place, the Moors attack'd a Work newly built before the Redoubt of Alcantara; but they were repuls'd, a Mine that was sprung doing great Execution among them, and order'd to retire with considerable Loss, only one Man being kill'd and two wounded on our Side.

Brussels, May 4. Count Konigleck was here again two Days ago, but is return'd to Antwerp, where Mr. Cadogan is expect'd very shortly, in order to renew the Conferances for settling the Barrier, and for regulatin' the Commerce of Great Britain, and of Holland with the Spanish Netherlands. M. Vander Duffen, one of the Deputies of the States-General, is also expect'd at Antwerp from the Hague; and as he will come furnish'd with new Instructions from their High Mightinesses, he said Negotiations of the Barrier and of Commerce will in all Appearance be brought to a speedy and amicable Issue. M. Tiquen, formerly of the Council of State, with M. Servati of the Council of Finances of these Provinces, are appointed by his Imperial Majesty to settle the Limits of the Netherlands with Commissioners to be nam'd for the same purpose by the French King, as soon as the Treaty of Barrier shall be concluded. Letters from Vienna intimate, that Prince Eugene of Savoy is in a readines to set out this way, being empower'd to regulate in the Emperor's Name the Civil and Military Affairs of these Countries, as soon as his Highness shall have Notice that the Treaty is finish'd for puttin' his Imperial Majesty into Possession of them. We have an Account from Dunkirk, that the Intendant le Blanc is expect'd back there from the Court of France the 6th Instant, with new Instructions concerning the Canal and Harbour of Mardyke; and that in the mean time they suspend what remains yet to be done for bringin' that Work to Perfection.

There being a Correspondence settled between Great Britain and Spain, by the way of Falmouth and the Groyne. These are to give Notice to all Merchants and others, that the first Mail from London for Spain went from the General Post Office in London on Tuesday the 29th of March last, and that Letters and Packets will be taken in at the said Office
