Which Addresses his Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Turin, April 24. The Dutchess, Downger of Savoy entring into her 72d Year on the 11th Inflant, received the Compliments of the Nobility on that Occasion. Their Sicilian Majesties arrived here on the 16th, but after 4 Days stay went back to la Venerie, where they will reside till all Things are ready for their Journey to Savoy, which tis thought will be about the Middle of next Month The Prince of Carignon lies dangerously Ill of a Fever Tis advised from Rome, that the Marquis del Borgo, whom his Majesty lately sent thither to endeavour t reconcile the D services with the Holy S. e. touchin. the Ecclefiaffical Authority and Immunity as well in Sicily as in his M jesty's Hereditary Dominions, has had an Audience of the Pope, and been referred by him to Car dinal Paulucci, with whom he has begun to Treat: There was at first some Difficulty about the Ceremonial but the Marquis was at length admitted to his Audience in the same Manner as the Ministers of other crowned Heads wearing his Hat and S word. Baron Schulembourg Lieu tenant General of Foot, let out to Day for Catal and other Frontier-Places towards the Milaneze, and is a fo to make a Tour to the Places on the S de of France, to review all our Infantry; and Count Non Lieutenant ceneral of Horse, will be going in a Day or two, to take a like Review of the Horse.

Madrid, April 29. On the 18th Instant an Express arrived from Utrecht, with the Ratification of the Treaty between this Crown and that of Portugal; whereupon the Peace was proclaimed with the usual Ceremonies, and Illuminations were made throughout this City three Nights fuccessively. The King and Queen assisted in the Church of St. Jerom at the Devotions and Offices of the Holy Week, and on Holy Thursday his Majetty washed the Feet of twelve poor Men, and served them at Table himself: The same Evening their Majesties accompanied by the Grandees and attended by the Guards, visited the feven Churches which are nearest to the Palace of Buen-Retiro, the Prince of Ashrias with the Cardinal del Giudice his Governor and all his Houshold preceding The 23d was fixed for their Majesties Removal to Aranjuez, with the Prince and the Infantes; but the Queen finding her felf a little out of Order, the Journey is put off to the 2d of next Month. Don Luis de Miraval who is nominated Ambassador to the Republick of Holland, and the Marquess de San Phelipe who

had the usual Allowances for Equipage advanced to them, and received their Instructions, are preparing to let cur on their respective Journeys by the End of this Werk: 'Tis believed they will foon be followed by the Prince de Cellamare who is nominated Ambassador to the King of France, because the Duke de Populi is ordered to follow the Court to Aranjuez, and to affift in the Privy-Council in the Room of that Prince. The Sicilian Ambassidor has notified to the Court the Death of the Prince of Piemont. Mr. Bourck, formerly Agent here from the Court of S. Germains, being appointed his Cathelick Majesty's Envoy to the King of Sweden, has had Order sent him to hasten to Pomerania: e'e will pass by Sea from Lisbon to Humbourg. Horning, by Order from the King it was fignified o Don Bernardo Tinagero Secretary of State for Affairs of the Marine and of Commerce, that he should reliver to the Marquis de Grimaldo a I the Papers relating to those Affairs, and also to those of the Indies which came into his Hands from the Time he has exercised this Employment, which his Majesty has thought sit to abo-ish: His Majesty has been pleased however, in Consideration of his diligent Services, to make him a Councellor of This Suppression of his Office gives Ground the Treasury. o believe, that the other Secretaries Offices will be reducid to two, as they were before Monsieur Orry's Plan of Administration took Place. The Advices from Barcelona import only that the imbarking of the Troops and proceeding on the Expedition against Majorca is still sufpended, till the Court fend Orders. We have an Account from Ceuta, that on the 12th of this Month being he Festival of S. Mary of Atrica, Patroness of that Place, he Moors attacked a Work newly built before the Redoubt of Alcantara; but they were repulsed, a Mine that was fprung doing great Execution among them, and orced to retire with confiderable Lofs, only one Man beng kiiled and two wounded on our Side.

Buffels, May 4. Count Konigleck was here again wo Days ago, but is returned to Antwerp, where Mr. Cadogan is expected very shortly, in order to renew he Conterences for fettling the Barrier, and for regulaing the Commerce of Great Britain, and of Holland ith the Spanish Netherlands. M. Vander Dussen, one of the Deputies of the States-General, is also expected at Antwerp from the Hague; and as he will come furnished with new Instructions from their High Mightinesses, he said Negociations of the Barrier and of Commerce will in all Appearance be brought to a speedy and amiable Issue. M. Tilquen, formerly of the Council of State, with M. Servati of the Council of Finances of these Provinces, are appointed by his Imperial Majesty to settle the Limits of the Netherlands with Commissioners to be named for the same purpose by the French King, as soon as the Treaty of Barrier shall be concluded. Letters from Vienna intimate, that Prince Eugene of Savoy is in a readiness to set out this way, being impowered to regulate in the Emperor's Name the Civil and Military Affairs of these Countries, as soon as his Highness shalf have Notice that the Treaty is finished for putting his Imperial Majesty into Possession of them. an Account from Dunkirk, that the Intendant le Blanc is expected back there from the Court of France the 6th Instant, with new Instructions concerning the Canal and Harbour of Mardyke; and that in the mean time they fuspend what remains yet to be done for bringing that Work to Perfection.
