#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of the University of Cambridge on 2nd April 1993, amending Statute E has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The purpose of this Statute is to award prizes from the R.A. Nicholson Fund for distinction in the study of Arabic and Persian, not only to students of distinction of both languages taken together, but also to students of one of the two taken alone, also to make the income of the Fund available for the encouragement of the study of Arabic and Persian in the University. #### **TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990**

The diversion of Highways (Ystradowen, Cowbridge) South Glamorgan) Order 199

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 248 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the diversion of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to facilitate the movement of traffic on and in the interests of the safety of the users of the main highway, which is to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted on appeal on 23rd July 1991.

The Order requires the provision of a new highway which shall be the diversion, and which shall be maintainable at the public expense and for which the highway authority will be South Glamorgan County Council.

During the 28 days from 14th April 1993, copies of the Order and annexed plan may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the offices of The Vale of Glamorgan Borough Council, Holton Road, Barry or may be obtained free of charge from the address, and quoting the reference shown below.

With the above mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cadiff CF4 5PL, (quoting reference ZC510-5-7-14), object to the making of the Order. In the preparation of an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

#### SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highway to be stopped up is at Ystradowen, Cowbridge in the County of South Glamorgan. It is that irregular shaped length of unnamed highway immediately to the west of the property known as Ty Gof which extends from a point 10 metres north of its junction with Cowbridge Road (A4222) in a general northerly direction for a distance of 41 metres, having a maximum width of 4 metres and a total area of 131 square metres.
