The Rainhill Stoops to Queensway Trunk Road (A568 Widnes Eastern Bypass Southern Extension) (Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1993.

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Higways Act 1980, in relation to the new Trunk Road to be constructed by him at Widnes in the County of Cheshire. The Order is entitled The Rainhill Stoops to Quensway Trunk Road (A568 Widnes Eastern Bypass Southern Estension) (Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1993 and it:

- (1) authorises him to;
- (a) improve highways;
- (b) stop up highways;
- (c) construct new highways; (d) stop up private means of access to premises;
- (e) provide new means of access to premises.

all at Widnes on or in the vicinity of the route of the new trunk road mentioned above: and

(2) provides for the transfer of each new highway to the Cheshire County Council as highway authority from the date on which he notifies them that it has been completed and is open for traffic.

Any person aggrieved by the Order who desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision in it, on the ground that:

- (a) it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or
- (b) any requirement of that Act or of regulations made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order.

may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date of first publication of this notice. On such an application, the Court may suspend or quash the Order or any provision in it.
