The Doncaster Borough Council South Yorkshire County Council (Various Roads, Doncaster) (Traffic Regulation Consolidation) Order 1986 (Amendment No. 31) Order 1993.

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd April 1993 the Doncaster Borough Council made an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 15th April 1993 will be to cause any vehicle proceedings in the road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this notice on reaching the junction with the road specified in Column 2 of the Schedule to this notice to make a left hand turn into that road.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted road may be examined at the offices of (i) the Director of Public Works, 15 South Parade, Doncaster, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. Monday to Friday and (ii) Central Library, Waterdale, normal opening hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 14th April 1993 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

DYFED COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Dyfed (Amphion Court, Pembroke Dock) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1993

Notice is hereby given that on 8th April 1993, the Dyfed County Council made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act").

The effect of this Order is to prohibit waiting at any time in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice. The Order contains the usual exemptions including the right for passengers to board or alight from a vehicle, for the loading or unloading of goods, for the carrying out of building operations and other works, for the performance of statutory powers or duties and to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated adjacent to the said length of road affected by the Order. In addition the Order contains the usual parking concessions for disabled persons in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

The Order will come into operation on 21st April 1993, and a copy of the Order, together with a map indicating the said length of road affected, may be inspected at the offices of the Dyfed County Council, at County Hall, Carmarthen, during normal office hours.

Any person whom desires to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
