Vienna, May 8. A Guard of 20 Men of the Garrifon of this City, is placed at the Gate of the House where Ibrahim Aga the Turkish Envoy is lodged, to prevent his being incommoded from the Curiolity of great Numbers of People, who otherwife would prefs in to fee him. He is allowed for his Subfiftance 85 German Florins a Day. 'Tis faid he will not have his Audience of Prince Eugene of Savoy before the End of this Week; and that the Court will delay his Departure from hence as long as, poffible, in order to fecure M. Fleischman (the Emperar's Relident with the Port) trom an Insult, in case Hoffilities fhould be begun on our Frontiers before he has Notice to retire. The Emprels Dowager Amalia, with the twon young Archdutcheffes her Daughters, made a Vifit Ye-fterday to the Emperor and Emprels at Laxembourg. They were received with great Ceremony, and dired with their Imperial Majefties in the Apartment of the Empress, who gave the upper Hand to the Empress Amalia. After which their Imperial Majeflies took the De version of Hunting 5 And the Elector of Trier arriving st Laxembourg at 6 in the Evening, went and met theil Majefties as they were returning from Hunting. His E lectoral Highness is lodged in the Castle of Laxembourg with the Gentlemen of his Court, and fuch of his House with the Gentlemen of his Court, and uch of his Houle hold as are necessary about his Person; the reft of his Domeflicks are lodged in the Villages, adjacent to the Seat and to this City. 'Tis talked at Court, that th Elector Palatine is expected here very fhortly. The Im parial Cuiraffiers of Schelling which is one of the finefi Regiments among the Emperor's. Ratisbon: May 13. On the roth Inflant the Dyet took Into Confideration the Means of repairing and providing the Fortreffes of Kehl and Philipsbourg at the common rExpence of the Empire. General Roht'in a Letter of the Sth Inflant has given Notice, that the high Waters 'of the Rhine have worn away already part of the Dam and Glatis at Kehl, and that the Counterform would be in Danger, if not prevented by timely Repair, to which end he demands a fpeedy fupply of Money. The Imperial Commiflioner Prince Lowenstein is not yet arrived, being detained at Vienna by his private Affairs. Count Furthemberg, who has been employed by the Emperour for fome Years in the Upper Circles, went thro' this Place laft Week for Vienna, being named a principal Judge or chief Officer of the Imperial Chamber at Wetzlar.

Stetin, May 13. The Marquis de Croiffi, Envoy Exraordinary from the Court of France, had Audience of the King of Pruffia on the 9th Inflant in the Camp, and delivered two Letters to his Majefly : On the 12th that Minifter fet out for Stralfund. 'Tis affirmed that his Pruffian Majefly has declared he will wait till the 20th Inflant the King of Sweden's Refolution on certain Terms of Accommodation, which the Marquis de Croiffi is to propose to him; and in the mean time the March of the Prince of Anhalt-Deflau, with a Body of Pruffians in order to diflodge the Swedes from the Iflahd of Uledom, is sufpended: All the Saxons from Lubben have joyned the Pruffian Army.

joyned the Pruflian Army. Hague, May 21. The States of this Province of Hol-land and Weltfrifeland adjourned themfelves on the 18th to this Day, and accordingly they met again this Morning. The Men of War which are to form the Dutch Squadron defigned for the Baltick, are to rendezvous in the Texel to Morrow; Rear Admiral de Veth is appointed to command it, and 'tis faid he has Orders to make directly to the Kattegat near the Sound, there ro meet and join the British Squadron, to proceed with them into that Sea, and to affift in feeing the Merchant Ships of both Nations bound for the Places there now in the Possibility of the Mulcovites fafe into their respe-dive Posts. The young Princes's Carolina Daughter of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, continues in very good Health: The Ladies of her Court will be treated to Night by Mrs. Cadogan: Her Highness waits only for a fair Wind to imbark at Rotterdam for Eng-land, her own and her Retinue's Baggage having been lent Yefterday on board the Yatchts. Prince Kurakia, Minifler of the Czar of Muscovy, went from hence ans Evening to pais over to England in the Packet-boat. the Bishop of Munster baving for some Years kept a Gar-ison of his own Troops in Bentheim, the Count of that Name has lately represented to the States General, that those Troops are very burthensom to the Inliabitents, that the former Bilhop of Munfter had promifed to withdraw that Garrison, and therefore defires them b use such inflances as may prevail with the prefent relate of that See to withdraw the same, the rather becaple that Place is fituate on the Frontiers of the Province of Over-Yflel: Their High Mightineffes have (ent this Remonstrance to their Deputies at Antwerp, with order to prefs Count Koningleck to use his good Offices to the End the faid Troops of Munster may be now withdrawn.
