WE crave Leave humbly to reprefent to your Majefly. that having used our of B Diligence to give Dispatch to the Business of the Commission intrusted with us; and there being some Chappels that n ay soon be ready to be made Parish Churches, and fome Churches in good Forwardnefs, me find our felves under a D ffs ulty how to proceed in perfecting the Establishment of f ch Chappels and Churches, for want of a due Maintenance for the Ministers who are to attend the Service of the fume: Without which, as we conceive, no Bifhop can regularly con ecrate a Church or Chappel nor can we effectually treat with any Patron concerning the Kight of Patronage, which by AA of Parliament we are directed and empower'd to do; nor will the pions Ind of this Comm flor for advancing the True Religion as profifed in our Church be fully answered, until a sufficient and ascertained Mainte na ce bo provil d,

Obliged by thefe Cinfiderations, and invited by your Majest ys most graceous Promise that this good Work shall fird all th Ercouregement you can give it: We prefume to ap prouch your Majesty with our most humble Requise that you would rouch afe to perfect the glorious Des.gn begun by your prous Predecessor our late most Excellent where by recommending it in the Manner your Maje(y f all think mof: proper, to the Care and U if dom of your Pa liament to provide juch Maintenance.

To which his Majefty was pleafed to make the following most gracious Answer.

I Shall very readily comply with what you defire being re-I folved to embrace all Opportunities of encouraging and perfecting a Work, in which the Honour of the Church of England, and the Advancement of our Holy Religion are fo much concerned

Constantinople, April 10. A presended Brother of the King of Perfia, who had applied fome Years ago to the Port for Succours against his Brother. and who, in order to keep fair with the Persian Court. was fent Prifo-ner to Tenedos, having made his Efcape lately out of that Island, went into the Lesser Asia, where he found a great Number of Adherents; but upon the Extortions he was obliged to make for maintaining those People, the Port ordered a confiderable Body of Troops to march againft him, which fetting upon his Forces unexpectedly, defeated him, and took him Prisoner : Atterwards he was beheaded, with 30 of his chief Bollowers, and their Hoads have been publickly exposed before the Grand Signior's Tent. The Venetian Bailo Sig. Memo is treated with great Rigour, being thrown inro a Dungeon in the Caffle of Abydos. The Turkifh Fleet lies off the Dardanel's, on Occation of the Admiral's being Sick: On the 24th pass the Dutch Ambassadour here waited on that Admiral, as the British and French Ambassadours had done, to make him the ordinary Compliment of withing him agood Voyage; on which Occasion the Admiral, pur-fuant to Order from Court, defired him to write to the States General his Principals, earnefly to prefs them, as antient, and true Friends of the Port, to forbid their Subjects to fell or furnish at Preight any Ships to the Republick of Versice; or during the War to fupply the Veneti-ans wish any warkke Stores. The Turktih Fleet will confift of 40 Men of War of the Line, befides the Ships from Barbary, 30 Gallies, and as many Brigantines of 44. Oars and carrying 1 50 Men each. 'Tis faid the Admiral has politive Orders to engage the Venetian Flect, the better to the Captain Balhaw was full before the Dardanells. facilitate the Conquest of the Morea,

Verice May 17. The Senate having received Advice f om all Parts of the Turks having declared War as guinft this State, have declared War likewife. The aufes expressed in this Declaration are, That fince the nonth of December left the Turks have under feveral Pierences violated in divers Manners the Treaty of Carlos vi z; and that they have feized the Bailo Memr a Minifter repretenting this Republick, and imprifoned him in or e of the Caffles of the Dardanells as they have alforhe Secretary of the Ambaffy in the Seven Towers. And Ordersare ent to all the Commanders of the Forces of this State as well by Land as by Sea, to fail upon the Subjects of the "ort, and to act in a Hoffile manner against them. The last Letters from the Levant import, that the Capuin-General Delfino. after having been joyned by tie Squadron commanded by Sig, Fabio Buorvicini, was al-anced with the Men of War and Gallies to Nepoli di Malvafia, to obferve the O timan Fleet. There was no Account of that Fleet's Departure from the Dardanells yet but the Captain Bashaw had detached forme Men of War to get Seamen in the Archipelago, because there was not a fufficient Number at Conttan inople to man he Ships. The Flee of this Republick fitted out to ppose the Turks, confists of 1 Man ot W r of 88 Guns, 3 of 80 2 of 78, 4 of 76, 4 of 56, 5 of 54 1 of 50. and 2 of 44 with 21 Gallies and other V.fiel. There are 14000 Men of regular Troops in the Pay of this State on he Morea. This Republick expects to be affifted by the Pepe's Galleys, which 'tis advifed from Rome are actu-ally fitrug out at Civita-vecchia. Those Advices add, hit General Marfigli being d-clared Superintendant of the fortified Places in the Ecclefiaffical Stare was preparing to go and view them all; and that a Deta chiment of Horle and Foot was ordered to Lorerto, to reinforce he Garrifon there, and detend the Place in Cafe the Furkish Corfairs should attempt to m ke a Defcent on that Part of the Coaft. This Government hath begun the demol thing of the Caffles at Final: Tis faid the King of Sicily's Minister here hath prefented a Memorial against it. On the 12th arrived a French Bark in 14 Days from Tunis, by which we learn that the Ships of War from that and other Ports of Barbary, "are failed

to the Levant to join the Turkish Fleet. Vienna, May 18. On Monday the 13th of this Month Ibrahim Aga had a Soleren Audience of Prince Eugene of Savoy, to whom he delivered a Letter from the Vizier Azem, without adding verbally any thing more than that the Grand Signior's Intentions were expressed therein. The Letter is faid to contain the Reafors upon which the Port has declared War against the Venetians, and numates that the Sultan hopes the Empereur will not concern himtelf in it, nor affift the Venetiaus in fo unjust a Cause; adding, that his Highness is defire us to live in good Intelligence with this Court, and will keep ftricksrlowitz. The Imperialists donot aply to the Perce pear diffored to undertake any thing this Summer on the Frontier of Hurgary; yet as it is rot doub ed here that the Turks, if they fould have Success in the Morea, would grow very haughty and turbilent Neighbours, this Court goes on in taking all nectfory Measures for putting the Army into a Condition to act 1 ext Spring if need be. The Saxon General Wackerbart is fill here, but intends to let out in a Day or two, in order to repair to the Confederate Army in Pomerania.
