

Patisbury, May 22 On the 20th Instant the Matter of Kebl and the public was a great debate in the Dyer; and the several of the Summits in the College of Hlects reported as the 20th of the remembrance Circle had done the Sessions before in the College of Princes, both the Conclusions were passed and exchanged, in order to their being respectively considered, and to come to a general Resolution. The Elector of Bavaria is still at Munich regarding the Affairs of his Country.

May 21. The Dutch Men of War designed for the Baltic were still in the Texel the 28th detained by contrary Winds together with the Merchant Ships bound for that Sea. On the 29th, about 7 in the Morning, the Prince of Carlinia went from this Place, and at Noon embarked at Rotterdam on one of the Royal Yachts; and this Morning about 3 a Clock the two Yachts with her Highness and her Retinue sailed from Rotterdam. Sig. Quini is arrived here from Venice, and is to proceed to England, being sent by that Republic to congratulate his Majesty King George on his Accession to the Throne. Letters from Paris for some time past have given Accounts of the breaking of many considerable Bankers and Merchants there, and in others of the chief Cities of France: I perceive also by the same Letters that the publick Bills on the Royal Funds are at a very large Discount: As the Disorder and Decay of all Business and Commerce in that Kingdom, has been in great Measure occasioned by the frequent Alterations of the Coin, an Arrest of the Council of State has newly been published declaring, That the King is sensible the reducing of the Coin to its real Value proportionally to the Rate which Gold and Silver bears in Foreign Countries, and the keeping it invariably on that Foot for the future, is absolutely necessary for the Good of the Kingdom and the Benefit of his People; and therefore that on the 1st of August next, the Louis d'or shall become current at 14 Livres and the Crown at 3 Livres 10 Sol and so remain unalterably for the future.

St James's, May 27. On the 24th the Princess Carolina Youngest Daughter of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales arrived here; having been received at Greenwich by his Grace the Duke of Somerset; a Detachment of the Guards attending on the Occasion.

St James's, May 27. This Day Monsieur le Baron d'Imhoff, Envoy from the Duke of Brunswick Wolfenbuttel, had a private Audience of His Majesty, to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell Master of the Ceremony.

He had afterwards Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales; to whom he was conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehall, May 27. On the 15th Instant His Majesty was pleased to confer the Honour of Knighthood on James Milson, Esq; of Great Eling in the County of Middlesex.
