The Council of State had formed 2 Plan for reducing the Land-Forces maintained in time of Peace by this State, from 46611 Men to 40270, as foon as the Treaty of Barrier shall be concluded; which Plan was not ill received by the States of this Province of Holland, and was fent to the other Provinces for their Perufal and Approbation; but the States of Gelderland have by their Deputies already made a vigorous Remonstrance against it, setting forth that they are ready to consent to any other Expedient for lessening the general Burthen of the Taxes, but that they cannot consent to this Reform, which would too much endanger the Publick Safety; being rather of Opinion, that the present Number of Forces should be increased to 50000. There are Letters from Adrianople by the way of Vienna, dated the 28th of April, which relate that the Captain Pashaw being very much indisposed, had been oblined to be carried ashore; and that the Departure of the Turkish Fleet from the Dardanells was tetarded till he should be able to take the Command upon him, or till the Grand Signior should appoint another Admiral in his Room.
