ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

CLWYD COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of Clwyd (Old Road Fronting Ysbyty Glan Clwyd, Bodelwyddan) (Prohibition of Driving) (Revocation) Order 1993.
