5. ### The Croydon (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (Amendment No. 1) Traffic Order 1993

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon on 3rd August 1993, made the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985. 2. The general effect of the Order will be to amend the Croydon

(Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) Traffic Order 1991, so that:

- (a) waiting by vehicles for a period of up to two minutes to enable a person to board or alight or to load or unload personal luggage will be prohibited on those areas of the carriageway in the London Borough of Croydon marked by a yellow "Bus Stop" marking; and
- (b) waiting by all vehicles will be prohibited between 7 a.m. and midnight throughout the week on the area of carriageway lying within or adjacent to the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice, which area will be marked on the carriageway thereof by a yellow "Bus Stop" marking and by a double yellow line within that marking.

3. The prohibition mentioned in paragraph 2(b) above, will not apply:

- (a) to a vehicle being used for a London bus service whilst picking up or setting down passengers; or
- (b) to a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
- (c) in certain circumstances (e.g. to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority, in connection with building operations etc., adjacent to the bus stop or to the removal of an obstruction to traffic or the repair etc., of the highway or of any of the services therein; or
- (d) where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or does so in order to avoid an accident.
- 4. The restrictions and prohibitions referred to would not apply to:
- (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform; or
  (b) anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on a highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 9th August 1993, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, at the Enquiry Counter, "One Stop" Facility, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.
