



well received; and that the Convention for the Cession of Rostock having been Signed there, the Danes were to take Possession of it Yesterday. The King of Denmark has named Count Sponeck to be Governor of the said Place. The rest of the Danish Army, proceed on their March to Pomerania to join the Prussian Army, and then Advance together towards Stralsund. Letters from Sweden tell us, that the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Castle, as Generalissimo, had ordered 20000 Peasants to march towards Finland, to guard the Avenues on that side.

*Hague, July 5.* The Province of Utrecht has given its Consent to the Articles of the Barrier-Treaty; and 'tis hoped that the other 5 Provinces will follow the Example of Holland and Utrecht. M. Palmquist, Envoy of Sweden, is said to have obtained Leave from the King his Master to retire from this Country to an Estate which his Father-in-law has in Westphalia. His Secretary M. Brice is to remain here to take Care of his Swedish Majesty's Affairs.

*St. James's, July 1.* His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Dr. Robert Cannon to be one of the Prebendaries of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter Westminster.
