Water will be impounded by four earth embankments and the object of the impounding works is to create fishing pools.

Colwill & Son, of Dingle Farm, Little Witley, Worcestershire WR6 6LF, is applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of the Shrawley Brook at NGR SO 78456435, a tributary of the Shrawley Brook at NGR SO 79156435, and a tributary of Dick Brook at NGR SO 78706585, at Dingle Farm, Little Witley, Worcestershire WR6 6LF, by means of earth embankments.

Notice of application for consent in pursuance of section 88 and Schedule 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991, that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority (Southern Region) by Southern Water Services Ltd. for consent to discharge to the English Channel from Dover Long Sea Outfall and from Storm Sewage Outfalls at Folkstone and Dover, Kent. This scheme has been proposed to achieve compliance with the Regulations under the EC Bathing Water Directive (76/160/EEC).

The application proposed that:

1. Dover Long Sea Outfall

There will be a discharge of up to 42,512 cubic metres per day (in dry weather conditions) of settled screened sewage effluent from a new treatment plant at Broomfield Bank, A20 Folkstone/Dover Road, Dover, Kent into a new 2,7000 metre long sea outfall, at National Grid Reference TR 3370 3825. Commissioning will result in the removal of existing unsatisfactory continuous discharges of sewage through short sea outfalls at Folkstone and Dover.

2. Dover Drainage Catchment

When the flow to treatment exceeds 592 litres per second and the 4,000 cubic metres storage capacity at Elizabeth Street P.S. Dover is exceeded there will be a discharge of screened storm sewage from joint storm outfalls, at National Grid References TR 3195 4012 and TR 3155 3982.

3. Folkstone Drainage Catchment

When flows to treatment exceed 564 litres per second and the storage capacity of 18,900 cubic metres within the Folkstone sewerage catchment is exceeded there will be a discharge of screened storm sewage from the new twin 740 metre sea outfall at National
