

Grid Reference TR 2422 3594. In very extreme weather conditions storm flows will be diverted to the existing Copt Point storm outfall at National Grid Reference TR 2417 3641.

The above proposals in (2) and (3) will severely restrict the frequency of existing storm sewage discharges.

In the event of an emergency at the Folkstone Junction Pumping Stations there may be a discharge of screened sewage effluent from either the twin 740 metre sea outfall, at The Stade, at National Grid Reference TR 2422 3594 or through the existing sea outfall at Copt Point at National Grid Reference TR 2417 3641. The pumping stations will be provided with full telemetered alarms and appropriate standby equipment.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Avon County Council (Woodstock Road, Borough of Kingswood) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle from entering, proceeding or waiting in that length of Woodstock Road, in the borough of Kingswood, which extends from its junction with Gages Road to a point 50 metres north of its junction with Westons Way.

Exemptions in the Order permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or wait in the length of road in connection with building operations, the removal of obstruction of traffic, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water or electricity, the pursuance of statutory powers or duties, police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes in an emergency. An exemption is also provided to enable any pedal cycle to enter, proceed or wait in the length of road.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft Order, which, together with a map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the undermentioned offices (callers should report to reception and ask for the Statutory Orders Section) and at Kingswood Borough Council Offices, Civic Centre, High Street, Kingswood, during normal office hours.
