HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Kent County Council (A229 North of Cranbrook/A262 East of Goudhurst Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1993

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has confirmed with modification the above Order which was made by the Kent County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

(a) to carry out the improvement of highways;

(b) to stop up highways;

(c) to construct new highways;

(d) to stop up a private means of access to premises; and

(e) to provide a new means of access to premises

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the Classified Road which the Council propose to construct at Wilsley Pound in the Parish of Cranbrook in the Borough of Tunbridge Wells in the County of Kent.

Copies of the Order (as confirmed) and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Director of Legal Services, Room 1.102, County Hall, Maidstone, Kent ME14 1XQ, and at Cranbrook Library, Carriers Lane, Cranbrook, Kent.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied within relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 1st December 1993, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
