Traffic Orders City of Bath

Notice is hereby given that on 11th January 1994 the County Council of Avon made the following Orders under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended:

- (1) Reference No. DRS/EP/1/020—the County Council of Avon (A4 London Road and A367 Wells Road, Outer Area, City of Bath) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Experimental Order 1994 under section 9 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act, the effect of which, for a maximum period of eighteen months, is:
 - (a) to introduce specified waiting/loading restrictions in the lengths of roads listed in Parts I to VI of Schedule 1 to this Notice;
 - (b) to introduce specified waiting/loading restrictions in the lengths of road listed in Parts I and II of Schedule 2 to this Notice (i.e. the existing Street Parking Places in these lengths of road will be suspended during the hours of operation of the bus length and
 - (c) to suspend the existing waiting/loading restrictions in the lengths of road specified in Parts I to VI of item (a) above in favour of the restrictions referred to in the said item for such time as this Experimental Order remains in operation. Lengths of road in the immediate area which remain unaffected are also included.

Exemptions are provided for any vehicle being used in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or accessible only from that length of road, of any building operations; the removal of obstruction to traffic; the maintenance or repair of the road or services therein; in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; Post Office services; boarding or alighting and police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes in an emergency. Any vehicle being used in connection with loading and unloading; taking in petrol oil, water or air from any garage; weddings or funerals; the cleaning of external windows, chimneys or the posting or removal of advertising material and in accordance with the current provisions for disabled persons' vehicles, except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. or between the hours of 4 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. as specified in the Schedules to this Notice.

- (2) Reference No. DRS/EP/1/020(a)—the County Council of Avon (A4 London Road, Outer Area, City of Bath) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Experimental Order 1994 under section 9 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act, the effect of which, for a maximum period of eighteen months, is:
 - (a) to introduce the indicated waiting/loading restrictions, subject to specified exemptions, in the length of road referred to in this Notice, and
 - (b) to suspend the existing waiting/loading restrictions in the length of road specified in item (a) above in favour or the restrictions referred to in the said item for such time as this Experimental Order remains in operation.
- (2) Reference No. DRS/EP/1/020(b)—the County Council of Avon (A4 London Road, Outer Area, City of Bath) (Reserved Bus Lanes) (Peak Hours) Experimental Order 1994 under section 9 of the said Act, the effect of which, for a maximum period of eighteen months, is to prohibit, subject to specified exemption, all vehicles
