Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order (which was made on 27th January 1994) or any of the provisions contained in it on the

grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 27th January 1994, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order is made as described in the notice of proposal (ref. 489) which appeared in Issue No. 53410 of *The London Gazette* dated 25th

August 1993.

The prohibitions are intended to alleviate both access difficulties and obstruction of the carriageway due to the parking of vehicles in this vicinity.

 - Goldcroft; Horsey Lane; Lyde Road; The Avenue; West Hendford; Westminster Street and Mill Lane (most of the cancelled restrictions are replaced by amended restrictions as included in the following paragraphs).
- 2. To introduce additional no waiting at any time restrictions in lengths and sides of the following roads:
 - Crofton Park; Eastland Road; Goldcroft; Grove Avenue; cul-desac off Ilchester Road; Kenmore Drive; Linden Road; Preston Grove; road leading from Hendford to Petters Way car park and the Octagon Theatre; The Park and West Park.
- 3. To introduce no waiting at any time restrictions during Mondays to Fridays inclusive in a length of The Avenue.
- To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on all days on the eastern side of a length of Lyde Road.
- To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the northern side of a length of West Park.
- 6. To prohibit waiting for a period longer than 15 minutes (with return prohibited within 15 minutes) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on a length of the southern side of Westminster Street.
- 7. To prohibit waiting for a period longer than 30 minutes (and to prohibit return within 30 minutes) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in lengths of Crofton Park; Goldcroft and The Avenue.
- 8. To prohibit waiting for a period longer than 2 hours (and to prohibit return within 2 hours) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in lengths of Horsey Lane and West Hendford.
- 9. To limit waiting to 30 minutes and to prohibit return within 30 minutes between the hours of 10.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in lengths of The Park and West Park.
- 10. To limit waiting to 30 minutes and to prohibit return within 30 minutes between the hours of 11 a.m. to 12 noon and 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in a part of the cul-desac off Ilchester Road.
- 11. To introduce one way traffic in The Avenue (between its junctions with Kingston and Colmer Road) and in Colmer Road in a south to north direction.

A copy of the traffic regulation Order, as made, together with a detailed statement of reasons for having made the Order, and maps showing the precise locations of restrictions concerned, can be inspected, free of charge, and at all reasonable hours at the following places.
