Notice of application to vary a licence to abstract water

Take notice that Notcutts Nurseries of Woodbridge, Suffolk IP12 4AF, is applying to the National Rivers Authority to vary licence serial number 7/35/06/G/079, to abstract water from a borehole into chalk strata, at National Grid Ref. TM 28845227 at Ufford (Melton Container Unit).

The variation being applied for is for one year only to increase the existing abstraction amount of 10,000 cubic metres per year at a rate not exceeding 200 cubic metres per day to an amount of 17,273 cubic metres per year. The rate per day of 200 cubic metres maximum will not be changed.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

Birmingham City Council (Hill Street etc. City Centre) (Traffic Regulation) (Experimental) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that, on 23rd February 1994, the above-named Council made the above-named Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, the effect of which is as follows:

To introduce "prohibition of driving" in that length of Hill Street between its junctions with Navigation Street and Swallow Street; and

To introduce "one-way traffic operation" in a north-westerly direction in that length of Hill Street between its junction with Navigation Street and Paradise Street and in a westerly direction in Paradise Street.

The Order will come into operation on 27th February 1994.

A copy of the Order, together with a map and a statement of the Council's reasons are available for inspection at the offices of the acting City Engineer, Traffic Management Division, 1 Lancaster Circus Queensway, Birmingham B4 7DQ, during normal working hours.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order, or of any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirements of the Act, or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to this Order, may, within 6 weeks from 23rd February 1994, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The above-named Council will consider in due course whether the Experimental Order should be made permanent. Persons wishing to object to the making of a permanent Order must, within six months of the date of this notice or the date of any modification which might be made, send a statement in writing, including the grounds for their objection to the address included above.
