GREAT GRIMSBY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Great Grimsby (Columbia Road Area) Traffic Regulation (No. 94-6) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that the Great Grimsby Borough Council, acting as agent for the Highway Authority, the County Council of Humberside, on 7th March 1994, made a Road Traffic Regulation Order under powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will come into operation on 8th March 1994.

The effect of the Order is as follows:

1. To introduce restrictions for No Waiting At Any Time in parts of Humberstone Road and Runswick Road.
2. To introduce a Cycle Lane in part of Humberstone Road.
3. To introduce a 7.5 tonne Weight Limited in parts of Columbia Road, Cooper Road, Fairmont Road and Weelsby Street, with an exemption vehicles loading.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may
