Venice, Aug. 23. On the 21ft arrived a Felucca, fent by the Proveditore General Emo from Dalmatia, with two Colours taken from the Enemy, and the following Relation. On the 2d of this Month the Turks inveffed Singh, and on the 3d attacked the Suburbs. The Inhabitants, fupported by a De-tachment of Grenadiers, and other Foot of the Garrison, stood two Assaults with great Bravery: But the faid Suburbs having no Fortifications for its Defence, they were obliged to give way at last, and let the Besiegers take Possession of it, as also of some advanced Works of the Place. Then the Turks railed a Battery of five Cannon and two Mortars, with which they played on the Wall of ordered to join the Danes, and that there is on the Town; and having made a fufficient Breach on the 14th, they gave an Affault, which held till the next Day in the Evening. The Befieged de-fended themfelves fo refolutely, that they forced had a private Audience of His Majeffy to deli-

Their Retreat being observed to be very disorderly, the Inhabitants with the Garrifon led by General Spaar fallied out, and being joined by the Country-Militia, (the Priefls and Monks taking Arms among them on this Occasion) pursued them close k lled a great N umber, took their Cannon and Baggage, and made them repais the Cettina with I recipitation to fecure the Remains of their Army in the Mountains on the other fide of that River. Ratisbon, September 5. On the 2d Instant the Con h on for difcharging the Inhabitants of Spire from h t they owe to the Imperial Chamber, was finally adjifted; with an express Clause, that this Favour which has been granted in Confide-ration of what that Town had fuffered, should into a Precedent; and that they not be di fould be regular in their Payments for the future, in D ault whereof the Dyet referve to themfelves a Po \cdot $(f \circ f)$ g in the Arrears which are now remit ed. Advices from Vienna tell us, that the't ount Konigfeck was publickly declared Am-bada or from his Imperial Majefly to the Court of Fran e, yet he is not to go thither till the Peace or Baden shall have been fully executed in very Point; for which End a Conference had been h ld with the Count du Luc Ambaffador of France, but he only took upon him to make Report of what paffed to his Court, without explaining h mfelf on any Particular.

Hambourg, September 10. In the late flormy Weather, the Danes loft fome fmall Veffels and Boats; but they have taken a Sw difh Ship having on Board 7200 Weight of Powder, 4000 Mulquets, 1000 Pair of Pillols, and a great Nun ber of Swords : Letters from the Confederate Army, of the 7th Instant, give an Account Likewife, that the Saxons had made a Booty under the very Ramparts of Stralfund, confifting of a great Number of black Cattle and Horfes; which without any Lofs they brought off fafe to the Pruffian Camp, tho' they were exposed to the Shot of more than 20 Cannon. The Confederates are faid to have good Information, that there are 4 Places on the Island of Rugen, proper for attempting a Descent, viz. atSpis, Feidbulch, Wittau, and from the fide of Greifffwalde: 20000 Men are appointed for that Descent ; a lefs Number was ordered at first, but the Kings of Denmark and Pruffia being informed that his Swedish Majesty has drawnall his Forces together on that Island, they have judged it neceffary to augment their Troops detached for that Enterprize; for which a Day is not yet fixed, the Pruffian heavy Artillery being first expected from Ste-tin, and some Transports from Copenhagen. Commiffioners are named for fettling a Cartel between the Pruffians and Swedes. Letters from Copenhagen of the 7th of this Month relate, that on the 5th at Night a Man of War of 50 Guns, detached from the Muscovite Fleet arrived there; which had renewed the Discourse that the faid Fleet is
