A Letter from Zant of the Venice, Sept. 6. 29th of July confirms the taking of Napol d Ro mania by Storm; and relates that the Turk had fince belieged the Castle of Patrazzo. This Let-This Letter says, that in the taking of Napoli di Romania, after the Turks had in the first heat of Action put many to the Sword, they made the rest Captives; but the Grand Visier causing those Captives to be produced, gave for them 15 or 20 Crowns munition for their Magazines; those which lay a head to the Soldiers who had taken them, at Vipallantea had been unladen, and the Amand then caused them to be butchered be munition sent to Tem swaer; and 28 others with fore him in cold Blood. The last Advices from our Fleet, are of the third past from Zant, where it had been joined on the 1st by 4 of ur new Men of War, which had been sent from hence as fast as they were sitted .t, with the Tr nsports under their respective Conv vs. The Fleet after having received that Reinforceme t. confiled of eighteen Ships of the Line, 2 Fire-flips, and 22 Gallies bei'des the 4 which were left in the heighth of Lepanto to hinder the Turk sh G.ll. its from passing towards the Morea. Another quadron of Gallies is lest under the Command of Signior Pisa i General of the Islands. The Captain-General Signior Delfino had caused the Sick to be fet ashore, and supplied their Room with other Soldiers and Seamen; and having called together all the Captains who ferve under him, he declared to them that he was de-termined to engage the Turkish Fleer, exhorting every one to do h s Duty, according to the Example which he h ped he should set them: He had hoisted his Flag on Board the Terrour, and had given the Command of all the Gallies to the General of the e of Malta; he proposed to fail the 4th cr 5th, and to take his Station at Sapienza.
