#### MEDICINES ACT 1968

##### *Addendum 1994 to the British Pharmacopoeia 1993 and Amendments No. 2 to the British Pharmacopoeia 1993*

The Ministers, that is to say the Secretaries of State concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, having on the recommendation of the Medicines Commission caused to be published the Addendum 1994 to the British Pharmacopoeia 1993 and Amendments No. 2 to the British Pharmacopoeia 1993, hereby give notice in accordance with section 102(5) of the Medicines Act 1968 that the subject matter contained in the said Addendum and Amendments shall take effect on 1 July 1994 except that where a different effective date is indicated in the text in respect of any part of that subject matter, that different date shall be the date for that part of the subject matter to take effect.

For the purposes of section 102(6) of the Medicines Act 1968, the printer to Her Majesty of all Acts of Parliament has been authorised by the said Ministers to print copies of the said Addendum and Amendments.

#### MEDICINES ACT 1968

##### *Amendments and Additions to the European Pharmacopoeia*

The Health Ministers, that is to say the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby declare under section 65(7) of the Medicines Act 1968 that on and after 1st July 1994 the amendments and addition to the Second Edition of the European Pharmacopoeia referred to in the Schedule hereto, are to have effect for the purposes of section 65 of the said Act.
