ST. James's, October 17. The following Addreffes have been prefented to His Majefty.

An humble Addiels of the Lord Polwarth, Lord-Lieutenant, Deputy-Lieutenant, Officers of the fencible Men Heretors of the Shire of Berwick or March; prefented to his Maje ty by Sir Andrew Hume, one of the Lords of Sciffon, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Vifcount Townfhend one of his Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State,

An humble Address of the Mayor and Burgess of the Borough of Fruro, in the County of Cornwall; prefented to his Majesty by Spencer Cowper, Esq, one of their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by the Right Honourab'e the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Alderenen, Affistants and other Principal Inhabitants of and near the Corporation of Pensarce in the County of Cornwall, presented to his Majesty by the Kight Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the Absence of the Right Honourable Hugh Boscawen Comptroller of his Majesty's Houshold, and Recorder of the faid Corporation.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Ratisson, Odeber 14. Letters from Milan of the 3d Iaftant give an Account, that the Turks had made themfelves Mafters of the Fortreffes of Suda and Spina longa in Candia; and heing encouraged by their great Succeffes would 'twas thought make an Attempt on the Ifland of Corfu hefore the end of the Campaign, for opening an eafter Paffage into Italy. The fame Letters report, that a contagious Sicknefs was fpread among the Venetian Fleet, and had carried off great Numbers of Men; and that the Pope's Gallies with thefe of Malta, had actually feparated from them to avoid the Infection. The Electors of Cologne and Bavaria divert themfelves at Munich with Operas, Balls and Hunting : The 12th and 15th Infant being the Name-Days of the Elector and Electreis, were defigned to be celebrated with great Magnificence. The Dyet has for fome Days made very little Progrefs in the Affairs before them. Copenbagen, October 15. Letters from Admiral Guldenlieu relate, that our Fleet is fafely arrived at Witmont; and that feveral Transports which went with it have joined Admiral Seeftedt, in order to be employed in the intended Defcent on the Island of Rugen. On the 12th 2 Ship of War called the Island failed from hence to join our Fleet, which now confists of 28 Men of War of the Line.

Hague, Oftober 22. On the 16th Infant Mr. Horatio Walpole, Minister of the King of Great Britain, arrived here, with Orders for Mr. Ca-doşan his Britannick Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary, to demand of the States General the 6000 Men itipulated by the 14th Article of the Treaty of Earrier made at Utrecht in 1713, to be furnished by their High Mightynesses when the fame should be required for the Defence of his Majefly's Dominions against any Attempts in favour of the Pretender. Mr. Eadogan accompanied by Mr. Walp le immediately communicated those Orders to the Penlionary, and that Afternoon they had a Conference with the Deputies of the States General and of the Council of State for Foreign Affairs. On the 17th Mr. Cadogan prefented a Memorial in form on that Subject to the States General, who on the 18th paffed a Refolution to order the faid 6000 Men to be imbarked with all Expedition for England. The Forces appointed for this Service are the Dutch Battallions of Palant, Welderen, Cronstroom, Rantsaw and Jacot, each of which Battallions confists of 500 Men in 10 Companies; the Dragoons of Wallenaar, who are to ferve on foot, confifting of 500 Men in eight Companies ; and five Swifs Battallions, viz. two of Sturler, two of Smidts, and one of Chambrier; each Bate tallion confifting of 600 Men. The General Offic cers who are appointed to command these Forces, are Lieutenant General Vander Beck, Major General Monteze, and the Brigadiers Sturler, Cronftroom and Labadie.

Berwick, Odober 12. Mr. Forfler, Member of Parliament for Northumberland, having engaged one Lancelot Errington in a Defign to Surprize the Calle of Holy Illand for the Service of the Pretender, the faid Errington with divers Accomplices attempted it, and fucceeded on the 10th Inflant. But yefterday fome Officers with about thirty Men of this Garrifon, and fifty of



our Townsmen armed who went Volunteers, re- ] sook the faid Caffle; making Errington (who was flot in the Thigh) and the rell Prisoners. The Rebels in Northumberland are reported to be about 300; they plunder the Country and take Horfes and Arms, and now lie about Warkworth and Felton.
