Notice of application to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority by Severn Trent Water Limited, of 2297 Coventry Road, Birmingham B26 3PU, for a licence to abstract from underground strata (Sherwood Sandstone and Lower Magnesian Limestone), at Manton Workshop, Nottinghamshire, at SK 6078 7829, as specified:

Not exceeding 20,000 cubic metres in any one day.

Of the quantity abstracted, not more than 13,600 cubic metres in any one day is to be used for public water supply purposes. Water abstracted from underground strata, but not used for public water supplies, is to be discharged to the River Ryton, at SK 6096 7875.

This licence is required following the closure of Manton Colliery, by British Coal, to authorise abstractions previously made without licence by British Coal. The licence will also replace licence serial number 3/28/75/9/S/R, which is held by Severn Trent Water Ltd., and which authorises the use of 3 million gallons (13,638 cubic metres), of the water abstracted, by British Coal, for water supply purposes. This licence is to be revoked.

The licence is required for the period ending 31st March 1997.
