WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

Cumbria County Council (Humphrey Head) Limestone Pavement Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that on 29th September 1994 the Secretary of State for the Environment, acting under the provisions of section 34(2) of and paragraphs 3(1) and 6(2) of Schedule 11 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, having considered the unopposed Cumbria County Council (Humphrey Head) Limestone Pavement Order 1994 which took effect when it was made on 4th February 1994, decided to take no action on the Order. This means that the Order continues in force.

The Order designates the lands described in the Schedule to the Order in accordance with section 34(2) of the Act and prohibits the removal or disturbance of limestone on or in that land.

Copies of the Order and map referred to in it and of this notice have been deposited at the offices of the Cumbria County Council, The Courts, Carlisle, Cumbria CA3 8LZ, and may be seen free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person who is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 34 of the said Act of 1981, or that any of the requirements of Schedule 11 to that Act have not been complied with in relation to it, may within 6 weeks from the date of this notice make an application to the High Court under paragraph 7 of Schedule 11 to the 1981 Act.

Proposed stopping-up of a highway at Rochdale Town Centre
