Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

Take notice that G. E. Murfitt & Son, New Pools Farm, Plains Lane, Littleport, Ely, Cambridgeshire CB6 1RJ, are applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to abstract water from main drains and farm ditches adjoining land in their occupation between National Grid Nos. TL55179215 to TL55699217, TL56699102 to TL56719092, TL56799047 to TL56839020, TL55289002 to TL54888947, TL57038994 to TL56848976, TL56788977 to TL56118929, TL57748921, TL57778909, to TL57808906, TL57998888 to TL57888871, TL57318802 to TL57258794, TL57628493 to 57728460 in the parish of Littleport, in the district of East Cambridgeshire, in the county of Cambridgeshire. The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 54.5 cubic metres per hour, 654 cubic metres per day, 16,000 cubic metres per year between 1st April and 30th September each year. The water will be used for spray irrigation of arable crops.

A copy of the application and any map, plan and other documents submitted with it may be inspected free of charge at New Pools Farm, Plains Lane, Littleport, Cambridgeshire, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning 8th October 1994 and ending 5th November 1994.

Notice of application for a combined licence to impede the flow of an inland water by means of impounding works, and to abstract water

Take notice that The Sussex Piscatorial Society, c/o John Baker, 60 Grebe Crescent, Horsham, Sussex RH13 6ED, is applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to impede the flow of a spring fed winterbourne rising at national grid Ref TQ15701185 and ultimately discharging into the River Adur, by means of an earth embankment at national grid Ref. TQ 16401240, in order to create a two acre trout fishing lake on the Wiston Estate, in the parish of Wiston and the district of Horsham, approximately 400 metres south-east of Wiston Pond. The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be approximately 18,000 cubic metres.

Take notice also that application is being made for a licence to abstract water from the same winterbourne, upstream of the new lake (at national grid Ref. TQ16301222), in order to supply spring water to Wiston Pond, which is also a trout fishery. This abstraction has been taking place, without awareness of the need for a licence, for over 70 years. Abstracted water (ie the discharge from Wiston Pond) is returned to the winterbourne approximately 400 metres downstream. Abstracted water is fed to Wiston Pond by underground pipe with an estimated maximum daily flow of 360 cubic metres; the winterbourne flow is intermittent and the average annual abstraction is estimated at 68,000 cubic metres.
