# **ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS**

### AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Avon County Council (Myrtle Hill Railway Bridge, Pill, District of Woodspring) (Prohibition of use by vehicles of over 3 tonnes maximum gross weight) Order 199.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 3(2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be:

- 1. to prohibit any vehicle the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 3 tonnes from proceeding in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice, and
- to revoke the County of Somerset (Myrtle Hill Railway Bridge)
  Pill, Easton-in-Gordano (Weight Restrictions) Order, 1967 as varied, by virtue of which the above-mentioned length of road is currently subject to a 10 tonnes weight restriction.

The prohibition specified in item 1 above is currently in force by virtue of the County Council of Avon (Myrtle Hill Railway Bridge, Pill, Woodspring) (Temporary Weight Restriction) (Temporary Suspension of Weight Restriction) Order 1993 which has been continued in force with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport until 14th February 1995. That temporary Order also suspends the Order referred to in item 2 above.

Exemptions in the Order permit any vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 3 tonnes, to proceed in the length of road if the vehicle is being used in connection with the removal of obstruction to traffic or the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the road.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft Order, which together with a map, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order and a copy of the Order to be revoked, may be inspected at the undermentioned offices (callers should report to Reception and ask for the Statutory Orders Section) during normal office hours and at Pill Public Library, Crockerne House, Underbanks, Pill during normal opening hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the County Solicitor and Deputy Clerk at the undermentioned address quoting ref: LET/P-6-028 by 2nd November 1994. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the County Council and that
