Pursuant to the provisions of Article 1(2) of the above-mentioned Orders, the Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs hereby gives notice that, by resolution 944 (1994), adopted on 29th September 1994, the Security Council of the United Nations, decided to cancel with effect from 16th October 1994, the operation of resolutions 841 (1993), adopted by it on 16th June 1993, and 917 (1994), adopted by it on 6th May 1994, which imposed certain economic measures in relation to Haiti. Paragraph 11 of resolution 917 (1994) remains in force.

In accordance with the provisions of the said Article 1(2), the above-mentioned Orders therefore ceased to have effect as from 16th October 1994, to the extent required in the above-mentioned decision of the Security Council.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The A55 Trunk Road (Abergwyngregyn, Gwynedd) (Restricted Roads) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 82 and 83 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to impose a 30 miles per hour speed limit on those lengths of the A55 Chester-Bangor Trunk Road (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), specified in Schedule 1 to this notice. As the proposed Order will also revoke the Trunk Roads (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 63) Order 1963, the length of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 will also be subject to a 30 miles per hour speed limit by virtue of the system of street lighting installed on it.

During a period of 21 days from 20th October 1994, a copy of the proposed Order and the Order to be revoked, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order, may be seen at the offices of Arfon Borough Council, Town Hall, Bangor, Gwynedd.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, and quoting reference ZC 510-6-4-61, must be sent in writing to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, by 10th November 1994. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection, it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE 1

That length of the trunk road at Abergwyngregyn in the county of Gwynedd which extends:

1. from the centrepont of its junction with Henffordd Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 60 metres.
2. from the centrepont of its junction with the access road serving the property known as Sunnyside in a westerly direction for a distance of 160 metres.
3. from a point 50 metres north-east of the north-east corner of the Station Road Bridge in an easterly direction for a distance of 90 metres, forming part of the access road serving Henfaes and Pentredu Farms.
