2. Kingsingfield Road, both sides, from its junction with London Road (A20) for a distance of 5 metres south-westwards.

3. Fawkham Road, on the west side, from its junction with London Road its junction with Southfields Road for a distance of 20 metres southwards.

4. Southfields Road, both sides, from its junction with Fawkham Road for a distance of 10 metres westwards.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait with police permission or for passengers to board or alight, for the loading and unloading of goods, for enabling work to be carried out in or adjacent to the road, for disabled persons and for emergency service vehicles.

A copy of the which comes into operation on 12th December 1994 and a map showing the length of road concerned may be inspected during normal office hours in the Highway Information Centre, Highways and Transportation Department, Springfield, Maidstone.

Wellington Crescent, Ramsgate (Plains of Waterloo to Madeira Walk);

Madeira Walk, Ramsgate;

Harbour Parade, Ramsgate;

Leopold Street, Ramsgate;

Queen Street, Ramsgate (Leopold Street to West Cliff Road);

West Cliff Road, Ramsgate;

Grange Road, Ramsgate;

Margate Road, Ramsgate (A253).

While the Order remains in force the Council may at any time lay or remove the authorised markings at or from any bus stop in a specified road or adjust the position in that road of the markings, as traffic conditions may require. It is the policy of the Council that this should not be done without prior local consultation.

Notice is hereby given that the Kent County Council, in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 32, 45 and 46 and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, intends to make a Road Traffic Order.

The effect of the proposed Order would be to introduce the

North-west side, extend no waiting at any time north-west side from the north-eastern boundary of No. 42 in a south-

westerly direction for a distance of 16 metres.

(6) Florence Road, north-west side, no waiting between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Monday to Saturday, from a point 12 metres east of its junction with Bower Lane in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 37 metres.

(7) Heathfield Road, both sides, no waiting at any time from its junction with Penenden Heath Road in a south-westerly

direction for a distance of 30 metres.

(8) High Street/Bishops Way, introduce a yellow box junction controlling the exit from the High Street and the south-eastbound entry into Bishops Way.

(9) James Street:

North-east side:

(a) No waiting between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Monday to Saturday, from a point 51 metres south-east of its junction with Boxley Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance

of 12 metres (revokes existing parking bay).
(b) No waiting between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Monday to Saturday, from a point 7 metres south-east of its junction with Quarry Square in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 12 metres (revokes existing parking bay).

(c) No waiting between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Monday to Saturday, from a point 54 metres south-east of its junction with Quarry Square in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 17 metres (revokes existing parking bay).

(d) Introduce residents parking bay from a point 26 metres south-east of its junction with Boxley Road in a southeasterly direction for a distance of 25 metres (revokes existing

parking bay). (e) Introduce residents parking bay from a point 19 metres south-east of its junction with Quarry Square in a southeasterly direction for a distance of 35 metres (revokes existing parking bay).
