Brussels, Dec. 28.

Geldermalfen and Gockinga arrived here from Antwerp AVA on the 20th, and returned to that Place on the 26th Inflant. They were feveral times in Conference with the Imperial Minister about the Artillery and Stores of War belonging to the States General, which are in the Towns to be given up to the Emperor, and which his Imperial Majefty defires may be left in those Towns for his Service. The foresaid Ministers are very near agreed on the Prices to be paid for the faid Artillery and Stores of War; and 'tis not doubted, but that Point will be concluded at their next Meeting, which is to be after the Holy. General, which are in the Towns to be Meeting, which is to be after the Holy- froms, viz. days, either at this Town or at Antwerp. The Imperial Minister and the faid Deputies had fome time ago agreed to fend two Ingeniers to take an exact Map of the Lands given in Propriety by his Imperial Majefly to the States General, for an Extension of their Limits in Flanders, the better to enable them to afcertain the Sum their High Mightineffes are to allow out of the annual Subfidy, as an Equivalent for the Revenues of those Lands; but for some Reasons that Survey is deferred, till the Ratifications of the Barrier-Treaty are exchanged. Letters from Liege of the 26th Instant fay, that 400 Men of the Troops in the Service of the States General marched into the Citadel of that Place on the 25th, to reinforce their Garrifon; from which they conjecture, that their High Mightynesses are resolved not to begin the Demolition of that Citadel, before the Elector of Cologne has given them Satisfaction in Relation to Bon.
