Brussels, Dec. 28.

M. Geldermalsen and Gockinga arrived here from Antwerp on the 20th, and returned to that Place on the 26th Instant. They were several times in Conference with the Imperial Minister about the Artillery and Stores of War belonging to the States General, which are in the Towns to be given up to the Emperor, and which his Imperial Majesty desires may be left in those Towns for his Service. The foresaid Ministers are very near agreed on the Prices to be paid for the said Artillery and Stores of War; and 'tis not doubted, but that Point will be concluded at their next Meeting, which is to be after the Holy-days, either at this Town or at Antwerp. The Imperial Minister and the said Deputies had some time ago agreed to send two Ingeniers to take an exact Map of the Lands given in Propriety by his Imperial Majesty to the States General, for an Extension of their Limits in Flanders, the better to enable them to ascertain the Sum their High Mightinesses are to allow out of the annual Subsidy, as an Equivalent for the Revenues of those Lands; but for some Reasons that Survey is deferred, till the Ratifications of the Barrier-Treaty are exchanged. Letters from Liege of the 26th Instant say, that 400 Men of the Troops in the Service of the States General marched into the Citadel of that Place on the 25th, to reinforce their Garrison; from which they conjecture, that their High Mightinesses are resolved not to begin the Demolition of that Citadel, before the Elector of Cologne has given them Satisfaction in Relation to Bon.
