#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposed to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act, which will authorise the stopping-up of a length of highway at Glebe Lane, Radcliffe-on-Trent, Nottingham, commencing at the western boundary of the bowling green in a north-easterly direction for 47 metres to the edge of the dyke at a point 3 metres west of the entrance to Dayncourt Comprehensive School.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission

granted to Radcliffe-on-Trent Bowls Club, by Rushcliffe Borough Council, on 26th July 1994, under ref. 94/00560/FUL.

#### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The County Council of West Sussex (Crawley: High Street Relief Road (A2219) Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1994*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by the West Sussex County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- to stop up highways;
- to construct new highways;
- to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- to provide new means of access to premises.

All on or in the vicinity of the route of the Classified Road which the Council propose to construct between High Street (A2219) at its junction with Haslett Avenue West (A2220) to the south, and High Street (A2219) immediately south of its junction with The Driftway, in Crawley, in the County of West Sussex.
