Venice, Dec. 13.

MR. Alexander Cunningham being arrived here with the Character of Resident from his Britannick Majesty, no tied the same to the Senate by his Secretary on the 10th Instant; and will have a publick Audience of the Doge assoon as the Ceremonial is settled. This Morning General Schulenburg came hither, having performed a Quarantain of 40 Days in the Lazaretto at Verona; where the Electoral Prince of Bavaria is expected next Week, to perform Quarantain likewise, before he proceeds to this Place. General Delfino is shortly expected, having obtained Leave to come home to give an Account of his Conduct the last Campaign. Sig. Marcello, Loredan, and Pasqualigo, are appointed Inquisitors, to examine into all Miscarriages during the said Campaign; and they have caused a Proclamation to be publickly affixed, declaring the Tenour of their Commission, and inviting all Persons to give them Information, either by appearing Personally before them, or by conveying Papers secretly to them.

Ratisban, Dec. 26 Letters from Vienna give an Account, that the Beginning of this Month the Marquis de Spinola, Envoy of the Republick of Genoa, was forbid the Imperial Court, on the following Occasion: Certain Imperial Officers, who came from the Island of Majorca, landing at Genoa, were required to deliver up their Swords; to be excused from which, some of them produced their Commissions in the Emperour's Name: But without any Regard had thereto, they were disarmed by Force, and treated otherwise with great Indignity. These Letters add, that the Imperial Court resent this Proceeding very highly, and that in order to procure full Satisfaction, they had resolv'd (twas said) to send 13 Regiments from Hungary to Italy.

Brussels, Jan. 4, N. S. A Dislike to the Treaty of Barrier having been infused into the Generality of the People of Flanders, the Ecclesiasticks and the several Colleges of that Province have of late been frequently assembled, to concert Measures to prevent his Imperial and Catholick Majesty from ratifying that Treaty, and to that End they have resolv'd to send a Deputation to Vienna to represent the Inconveniencies which they apprehend will result to these Provinces from some Articles of it. They likewise wrote to the States of Brabant to joyn in the said Deputation, which the latter have consented to, and already named their Deputies for this Occasion. But on the 1st Instant the Imperial Minister Count Kinigslegg received, by an Express from Vienna, the Emperour's Ratification of the said Treaty, in its full Extent, and without any Restriction. Im-

mediately after the Arrival of this Express, Count Kinigslegg dispatched a Courier to Antwerp, to give the Deputies of the States General who are at that Place an Account of it. M. Buys having obtained Leave from the States General to return from his Embassy in France, passed through this Town on the 2d in his Way to the Hague.

From on Board the Burford in Ousley-Bay, Dec. 30. On the 28th arrived here Commodore Hopson, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, in eight Days from Copenhagen; and is now unmooring, in order to proceed to the Nore.

St. James's, Jan. 2. His Majesty has received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, on the New Year: Upon which Occasion there was a very numerous and Splendid Appearance at Court.
