Letters add, that the Marshal Gorzinski, and several other Palatines, were made Prisoners; and that there was Ground to believe a General Accomodation will be concluded at Posen; in which Case most People are of Opinion His Polish Majesty will return from Posen to this Place, to be present as a General Diet of the States of Saxony. We hourly expect the further Particulars of this Affair of Lamosc, which 'tis generally believed will put an End to the Troubles in Poland; in the mean Time a Cessation of Arms is actually agreed on till the 15th of this Month.
