The Wigan Borough (Logwood Avenue/Ridyard Street, Worsley Mesnes) (Prohibition of Waiting/Loading/Unloading) Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Wigan Borough Council, in exercise of its powers under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, has made the Wigan Borough (Logwood Avenue/Ridyard Street, Worsley Mesnes) (Prohibition of Waiting/Loading/Unloading) Order 1995 which will come into operation on 10th April 1995.

The effect of the Order is to introduce no waiting at any time and no loading/unloading at any time on the following lengths of road:

- (i) *Ridyard Street*, both sides, from a point 15 metres north of Logwood Avenue to a point 15 metres south of Logwood Avenue;
- (ii) *Logwood Avenue*, south side, from a point 15 metres west of Ridyard Street to a point 15 metres east of Ridyard Street;
- (iii) *Logwood Avenue*, north side, from a point 15 metres west of Ridyard Street to a point 40 metres east of Ridyard Street.

A copy of the Order and of the relevant map may be inspected at the New Town Hall, Library Street, Wigan, between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on any day from Monday to Friday.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained therein on the ground:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
- (b) that any requirement of the said section 1, or of Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act, or of any regulations made under the said Part III of Schedule 9, has not been complied with,

may within 6 weeks of 23rd March 1995 make application for the purpose to the High Court. (Quote ref. HW13D102.)

EAST HAMPSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDING AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990, SECTION 69

Designation of Anstey as a Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of East Hampshire in pursuance of powers conferred on them by section 69 of the Planning (Listed Building and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 have designated a further area as a Conservation Area at Anstey, Alton in Hampshire. The area covered being so designated by the Council on 15th February 1995. The Conservation Area covers the following areas of land:

Land at Anstey Road north-east of its junction with Anstey Lane including properties fronting onto and south-east of Anstey Road, Numbers 69-101 Anstey Road, Number 82 Anstey Road and including land between the rear of Number 82 and the southern boundary of Anstey Park.

The boundary extends north-east to include Mayfield School, Anstey Cottage, Numbers 2-4 and Number 5 Anstey Mill Lane and its outbuildings.

North of Mayfield School the boundary includes Numbers 105-115 Anstey Road and Chandos Lodge, Claines and Numbers 1-13 London Road.

A 15 metres strip of land including a line of trees on the south-east edge of Anstey Park fronting Anstey Road at London Road between the park entrance and Numbers 2-4 London Road.

The boundary extends north to include the Queens Head public house and cottages to its rear, Numbers 10-14 and 16-18 London Road, and includes the trees within the forecourt of the Grange Hotel fronting onto London Road,

With very few exceptions buildings within the Conservation Area may not be demolished except with the consent of the Local Planning Authority, and there are other special controls relating to extensions and alterations. Trees may not be topped, lopped, felled, uprooted or wilfully damaged or destroyed, unless notice of this proposed action has been given to the Local Planning Authority and permission to proceed has been received from them or they have

failed to take conclusive action regarding the notice within 6 weeks from the time it was served. Trees already included in any Tree Preservation Orders are not subject to this procedure, but are subject, instead, to the more stringent requirement of the appropriate Order.

A plan showing the precise extent of the Conservation Area is available for public inspection between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and 9 a.m. on Fridays at the main reception desk of the Development Services Division, East Hampshire District Council, Penns Place, Petersfield. A copy of the plan is also deposited with the Clerk of Alton Town Council at Market Square, Alton. Further information and details of policy may be obtained from the Head of Development Services Division, S. J. Olivant, at Penns Place, Petersfield, Hampshire.

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Designation of Puffers Green Conservation Area, Harlow

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, the Harlow District Council, at its Meeting of 18th January 1995, resolved to designate Puffers Green a Conservation Area.

The boundary of the area is as follows:

The eastern boundary runs north from the junction with Second Avenue, along the western boundary of the A414 road, until it meets a track. West along the track for 75 metres. Then north along the eastern boundary of Coppings and then west along its northern boundary. On reaching Latton Street it goes north for 30 metres then west for 50 metres then south along the western boundary of Latton Farm and the Kennels. The boundary continues south along the same line until the access road to Puffers Green, and then south-west until the field boundary with Second Avenue. Finally it follows the field boundary east until the field boundary with the A414.

HIGHWAYS ACTS

NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTIONS 116 AND 117

Notice is hereby given that application will be made to the Justices of the Peace sitting at the Magistrates Court, the Assembly Rooms, East Dereham, on 8th June 1995, at 10.30 a.m., for an Order authorising the stopping up of a section of highway verge and a connecting section of highway in the Parish of Narborough.

The section of highway verge to be stopped up is located on the southern side of Denny's Walk, running westwards adjacent to properties numbered 17, 19, 21, 23, 25, 34, 32 and 30 and the properties known as "Clairmarlyn" and "Gate House". The connecting section of highway to be stopped up is situated between the property numbered 30 and the property known as "Clairmarlyn".

The total length of the affected sections of highway is approximately 185 metres and the total width is between 5 metres and 0.1 metres. The total area to be stopped up is approximately 610 square metres.
