### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The County Council of Humberside (Ennerdale Link Road, Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1994*

### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The County Council of Humberside (River Hull Bridge) Scheme 1994*
