(v) in the case of fresh meat from sheep and goats, animals which have not come from a holding which for health reasons is subject to prohibition as a result of an outbreak of ovine or

caprine brucellosis during the previous six weeks.

3. The fresh meat described above is obtained from an establishment or establishments in which, after a case of foot and mouth disease has been diagnosed, further preparation of meat for export to the Community has been authorised only after slaughter of all animals present, removal of all meat, and the total cleaning and
