Proposed Stopping-up of a Highway at Cheadle Hulme, Stockport

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Tarmac Housing Division on behalf of McLean Homes North West and Cheshire, he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act, which will authorise the stopping-up of a length of an unnamed highway off Chedlee Drive, Cheadle Hulme at its junction with the westerly side of Chedlee Drive located at a point 75 metres south of the junction of Long Croft Lane with Chedlee Drive and extending westwards for a distance of approximately 10 metres to its cul-de-sac end.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permissions granted to Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council on 7th September 1993, under reference 58341 and to McLean Homes North West on 12th April 1994, under reference 59440.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during the 28 days commencing on 10th May 1995 at the Inquiry Desk, Town Hall, Stockport, and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Department of Transport (quoting reference GO/TNW 5086/35/1/013) at the address below.

Any person may object to the making of the proposed Order within the period of 28 days commencing on 10th May 1995, by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, quoting the above reference, at the Department of Transport, Government Office for the North West, Sunley Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE.

In preparing an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of it may be imparted to other persons who may be affected by it and that those persons may wish to communicate with the objector about it.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of West Yorkshire) (Bradford No. 4) Order 1995" authorising the stopping-up of Danby Avenue and lengths of Bierley House Avenue, Dunsford Avenue, Roundell Avenue, Rawling Avenue, and a length of footpath off Roundell Avenue at Bierley Estate, Bradford. The Order will require an improvement of a section of Roundell Avenue by reconstruction and the provision of new areas of highway and a new footpath.

DISEASES OF FISH ACT 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food having reasonable grounds for suspecting that certain inland waters and land adjacent to them are infected areas, has made the Diseases of Fish (Designated Areas) (England) (No. 8) Order 1995.

The Order designates that area for the purpose of section 2 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937, and restricts the movement of live fish and eggs of fish without the previous consent, in writing, of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.

The Order came into force on 5th May 1995.
