Doctor of Law, and Judge of the said Court, requiring and impowering him to proceed in all Causes relating to Prizes, and several Prizes have been since condemned; Henry Barret, Esq; His Majesty's Procurator-General, doth hereby give Notice to the Captains, Officers, and Matrosses of His Majesty's Ships the Tartar and Nottingham, and to their Agents, that he hath taken out Writs, under the Seal of the said Court, for Condemnation of the Ships Florissant, Fortune of Marseilles and the Triumphant-Galley, taken as Prize by the said Men of War; and that the said Prizes, may be condemned, when the Parties concerned apply to the said Procurator-General. And all other Captains, Officers, and Mariners of Men of War, and their Agents may hereby take Notice, that their Prizes may be condemned, upon due Application to the said Procurator-General.
