Bruffels, Feb. 15. On the 12th Inftant the Imperial Troops took Poffettion of Mons and Ottend; Count Vehlen Major General is to command in the former, and M. Salablanca in the latter. The Imperialists are this Day to take Poffeffion of the Calle of Ghent; and fome of those Troops are on the March towards the other Garrifons which are to be evacuated by the States General. Westerloo's Regiment of Horle marched from this Place Regiment of Horfe marched from this Place the 12th for Courtray, and Devenitz's Re-giment of Foot arrived here Yefferday from Mons. Letters from Ratisbon of the third Inftant advife, that Count d' Urfel and M. del Campo Burgomafter of Antwerp, two of the Perfons deputed by the States of Bra-bant to reprefent their Grievances at Vienna, paffed through that Place on the 30th of January ; but that the Bifhop of Antwerp, who is the third Perfon in that Deputation, mas not then arrived. The Count d' Urfel takes his Way by Munich, in order to pay his Refercts to the Elector of Bavaria. *Whitehall, Feb.* 13. Yefterday Morning ar-rived an Exprefs with the following Account. *Montrofe, Feb.* 6. On Saturday the 4th of February the Pretender received Advice here, about 4 in the Afternoon, that Part of the King's Army was advancing towards Aberbros.

King's Army was advancing towards Aberbrothic, a Town within 8 Miles of this Place ; whereupon he ordered the Clans which had remained with him after his Flight from Perth, to be ready to march about 8 at Night towards Aberdeen, where he affured them a confiderable Force would foon come to them from France. At the Hour appointed for their March, the Pretender ordered his Horfes to be brought before the Door of the House in which he lodged, and the Guard which ufually attended him to mount, as if he defigned to go on with the Clans to Aberdeen: But at the fame time he flipped privately out on Foot, accompanied only by one of his Domesticks, went to the Earl of Mar's Lodgings, and from thence by a By way to the Water Side, where a Boat waited, and carried him and the Earl of Mar on board a French Ship of about 90 Tuns called the Maria Terefa of St. Malo : About a Quarter of an Hour after, two other Boats carried the Earl of Melfort and the Lord Drummond, with Lieutenant General Sheldon and ten other Gentlemen, on board the fame Ship; and then they housted Sail and put to Sea. The Lord Tinmouth, and the Earls Marishal and Southesk, were left behind to Ihift for themselves. The Clans are for the most part dispersed and run to the Mountains; the few who continue in a Body are gone to wards Aberdeen. Lieutenant General Cadogan arrived here Yest rday in the Asternoon, with the Regiments of Wills Edgerton and Clayton, and 600 detached Four. The Duke of Argyll came last Night to Brechin, within 5 Miles of this Place, with all the Dragoons : Lieutenant-General Vanderbeck with the Foot, lay at Aberbrothic; and they all continue their March to Day towards Aberdeen, in Pursuit of the Rebels.
