South Yorkshire County Council (Various Roads Thorne) (Consolidation of Waiting Restriction Prohibition of Driving through One-way Streets and Prohibited Turns) Order 1980 (Amendment No.) Order 199 .

Notice is hereby given that the Doncaster Borough Council propose to make an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit the waiting by vehicles on those lengths of King Edward Road at Thorne specified in the Schedule to this notice.
