Ratisbon, Feb 13. N. S. Letters from Turkey and Transilvania are full of the Preparations for War, and the Advance of the Turkish Troops in great Numbers into the Neighbourhood of Temeswaer and Belgrade. The Imperialists are no less diligent on their Side; they have already 80000 Men in Hungary, which will be augmented to 110000 by that time the Campaign can conveniently be opened. 8 or 10000 Men, most of them new Levies, raised in Swabia, Franconia, and these Parts of Germany, will have their Rendezvous in the Burgau near Ulm in a few Weeks, and will from thence be sent down the Danube to Hungary. Notwithstanding these Motions on both Sides, the last Letters from Vienna say there was more likelihood of Peace than War: The Imperial Court continued willing to decline it, and the Resolution of the Port would not be known till the Great Divan, which was to be held this Month.

*Aberdeen, Feb. 13.* The Duke of Argyll has received a Letter from Major-General Evans, giving an Account, that the Party of Rebels which he pursued, got to Frazerburg a March before him, and when he arrived there were gone to Bamf. Hereupon he detached after them Colonel Campbell of Fanab, with 40 Dragoons and 400 Foot, and is himself returning hither with 160 Dragoons: The Pretender's Physician surrendered to him at Frazerburg. This Afternoon the Duke of Argyll had Intelligence from Colonel Grant who is in Possession of Castle-Gordon, that General Gordon and the main Body of the Rebels having come that Way, were marched up Strath-Spey and Strath-Don; which 'tis concluded must be with an Intent to separate and retire each Clan to their own Country: Hereupon the Passage being left clear betwixt this Place and Inverness, his Grace designs to order four Battalions and one Regiment of Dragoons designed to be quartered in that Part of the Country, to march on the 15th Instant towards Inverness: And the rest of His Majesty's Troops will forthwith be sent into the Quarters assigned them. Major Urquhart, Smith of Methwen, Bennerman of Elrick and his Brother, and Fotheringham of Pourie, have come in and surrendered themselves.
